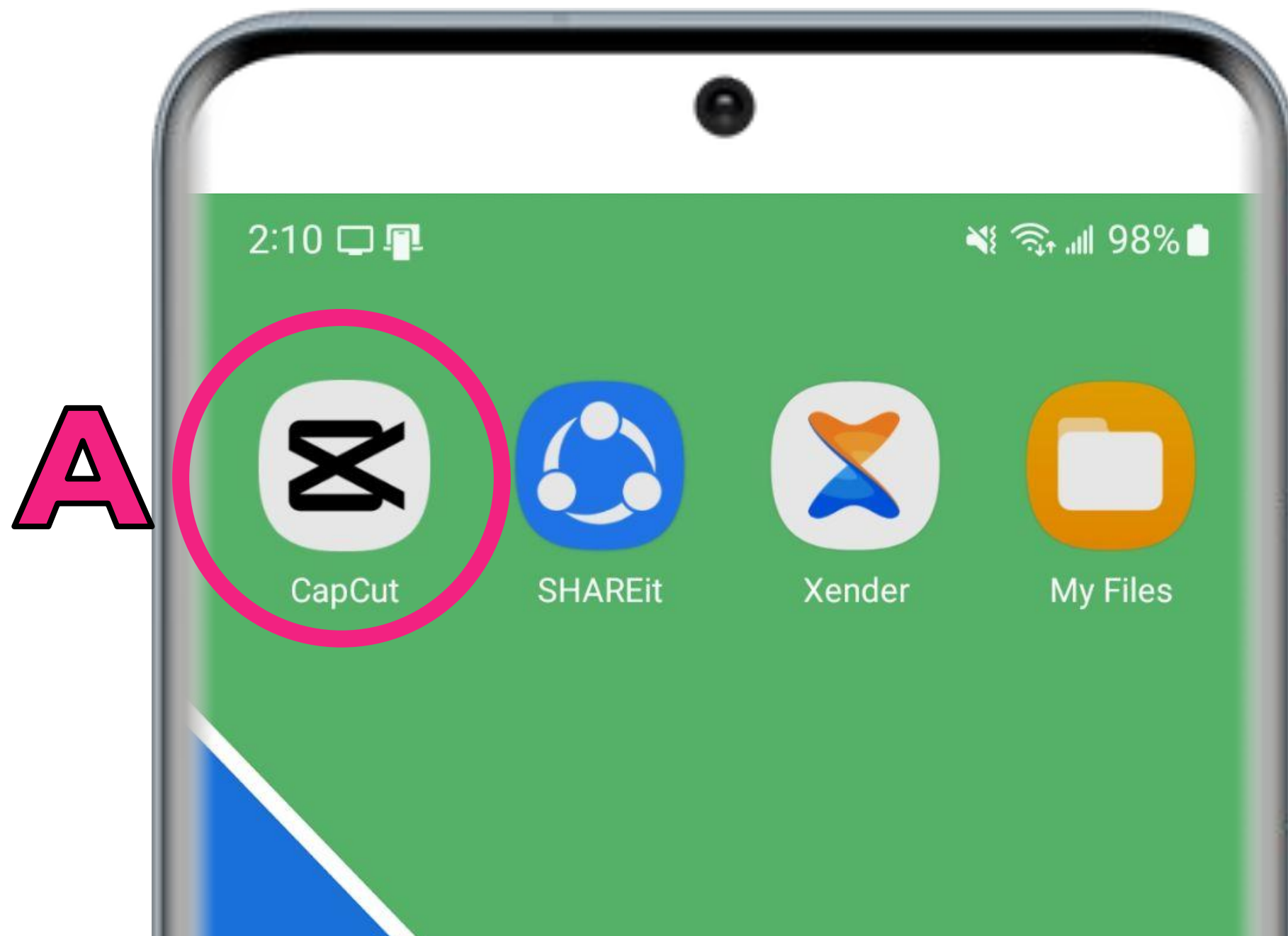


1. Creating a new project

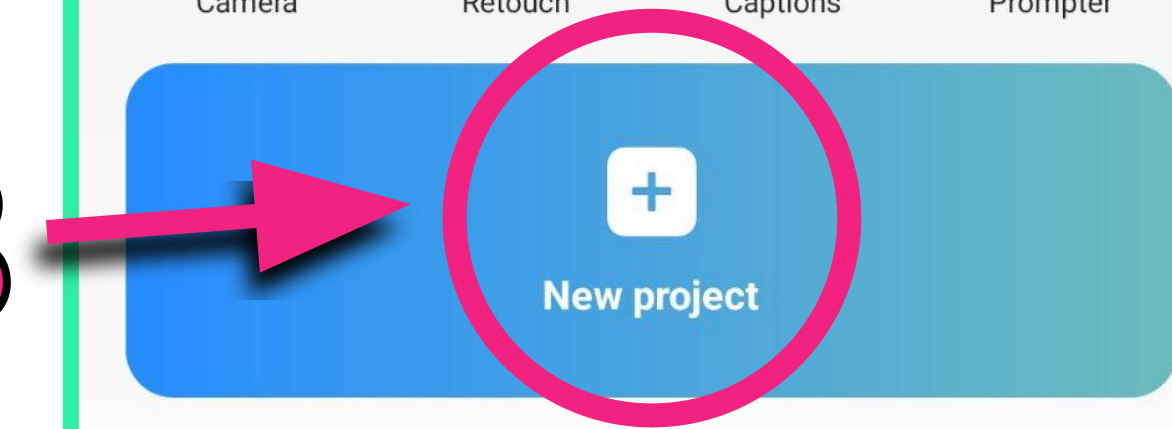

B. Select **+ New project**

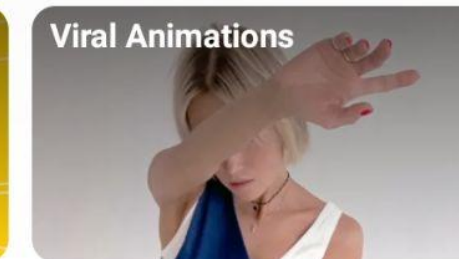

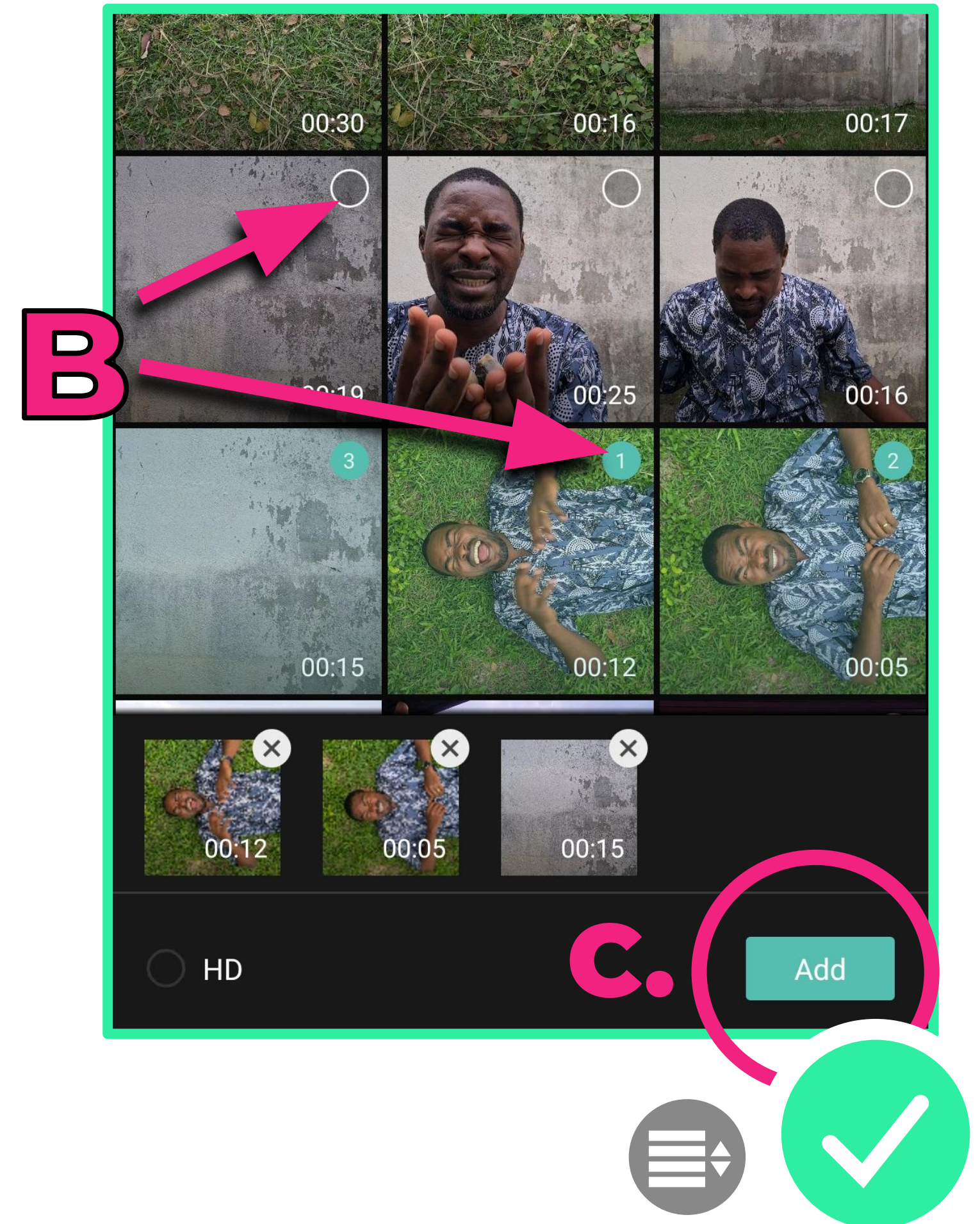
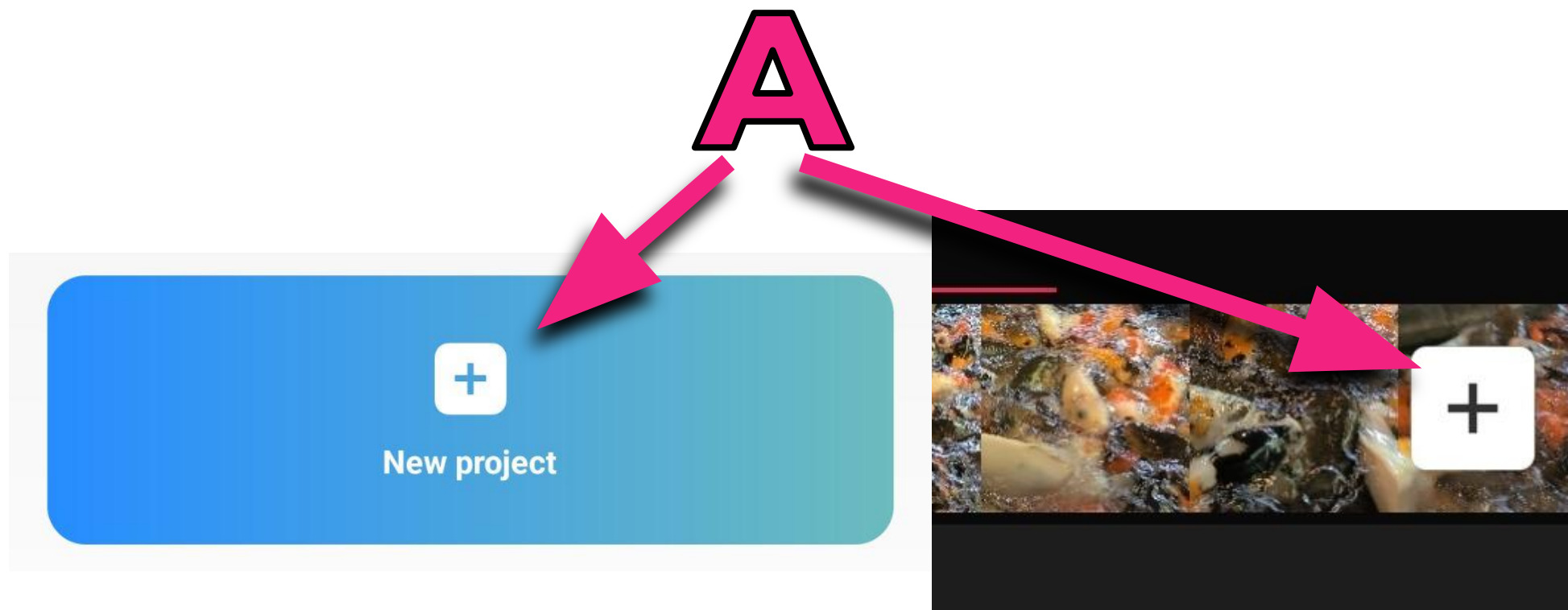

a. Adding video clips

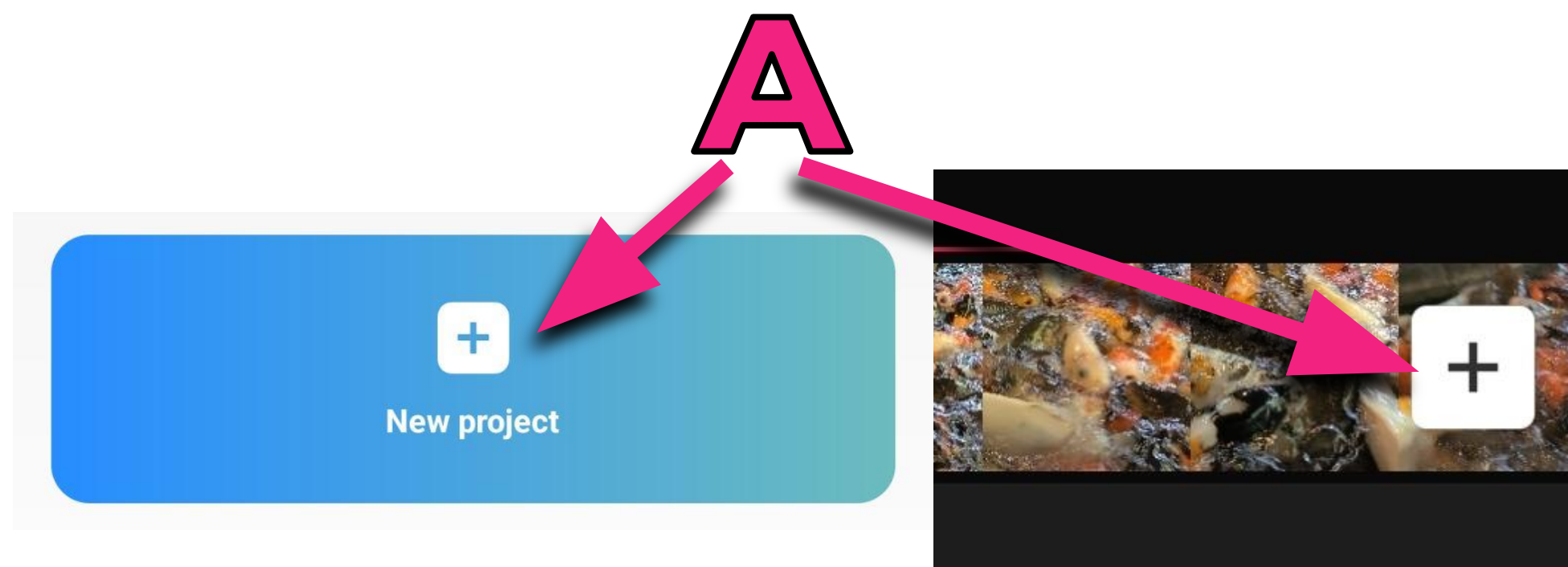
- A. Add a new video clip to your edit by selecting **New project** or the **+ button** at the end of the editing timeline.
- B. Select the clip(s) you would like to add by clicking the circle in top right corner of the clip.
- C. Then select **Add** to add it to your timeline.



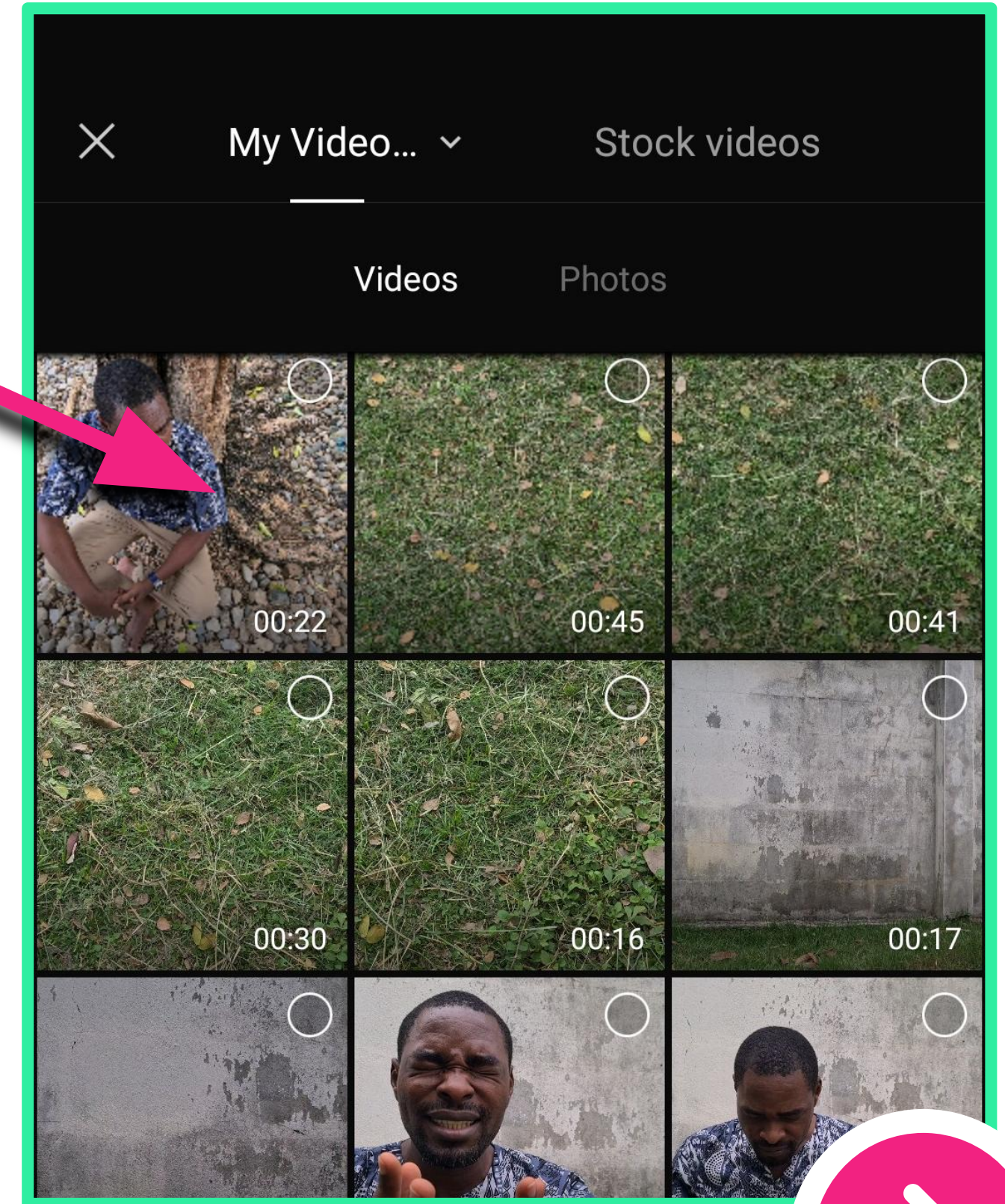
a. Trim/crop clips

Before bringing a video into your editing workspace we recommend you trim/crop only the segment you need.

- A. Add a new video clip to your edit by selecting **New project** or the **+** button at the end of the editing timeline.
- B. **Select** the clip you wish to trim (do not select the top right circle for this method)



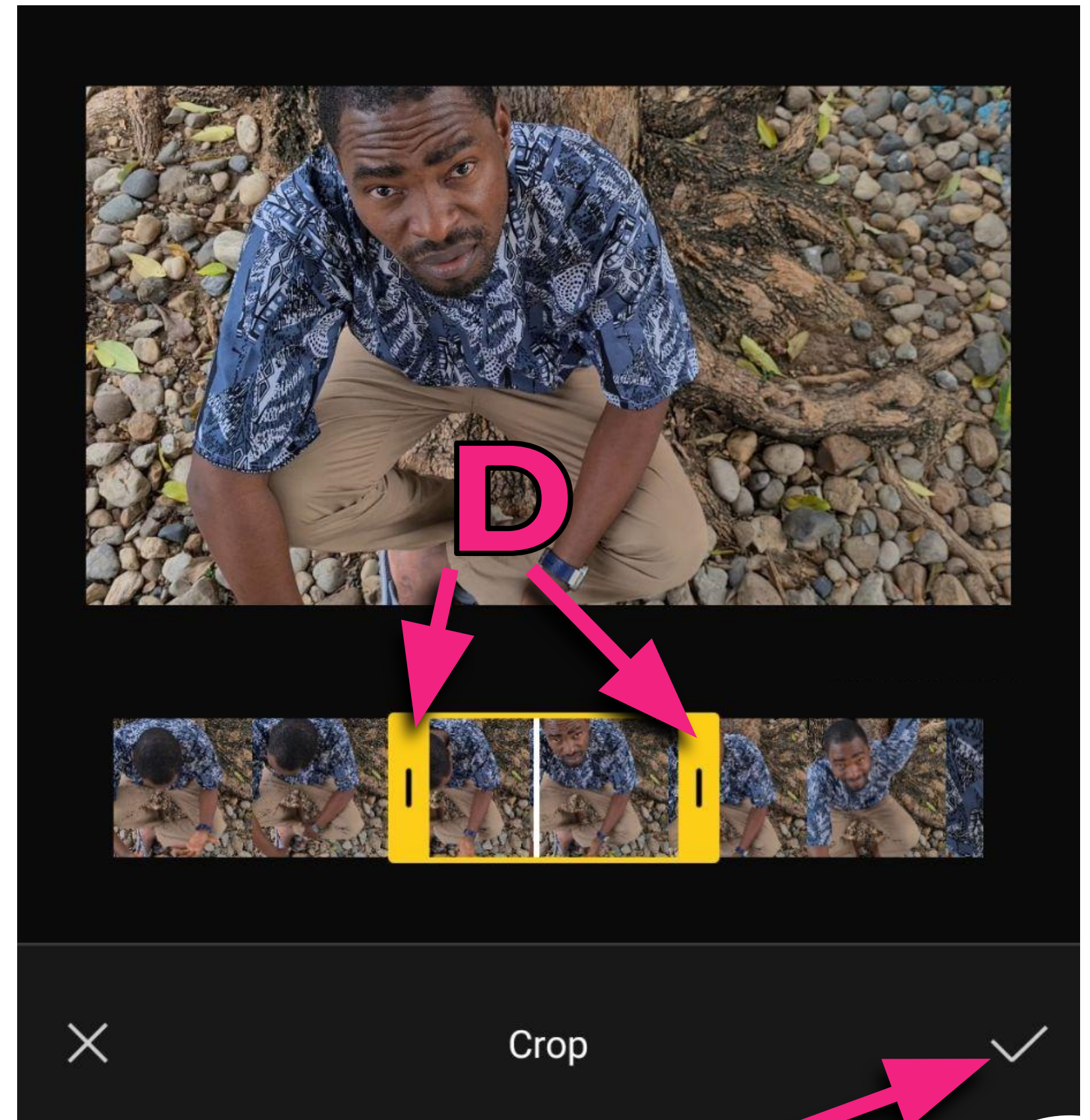
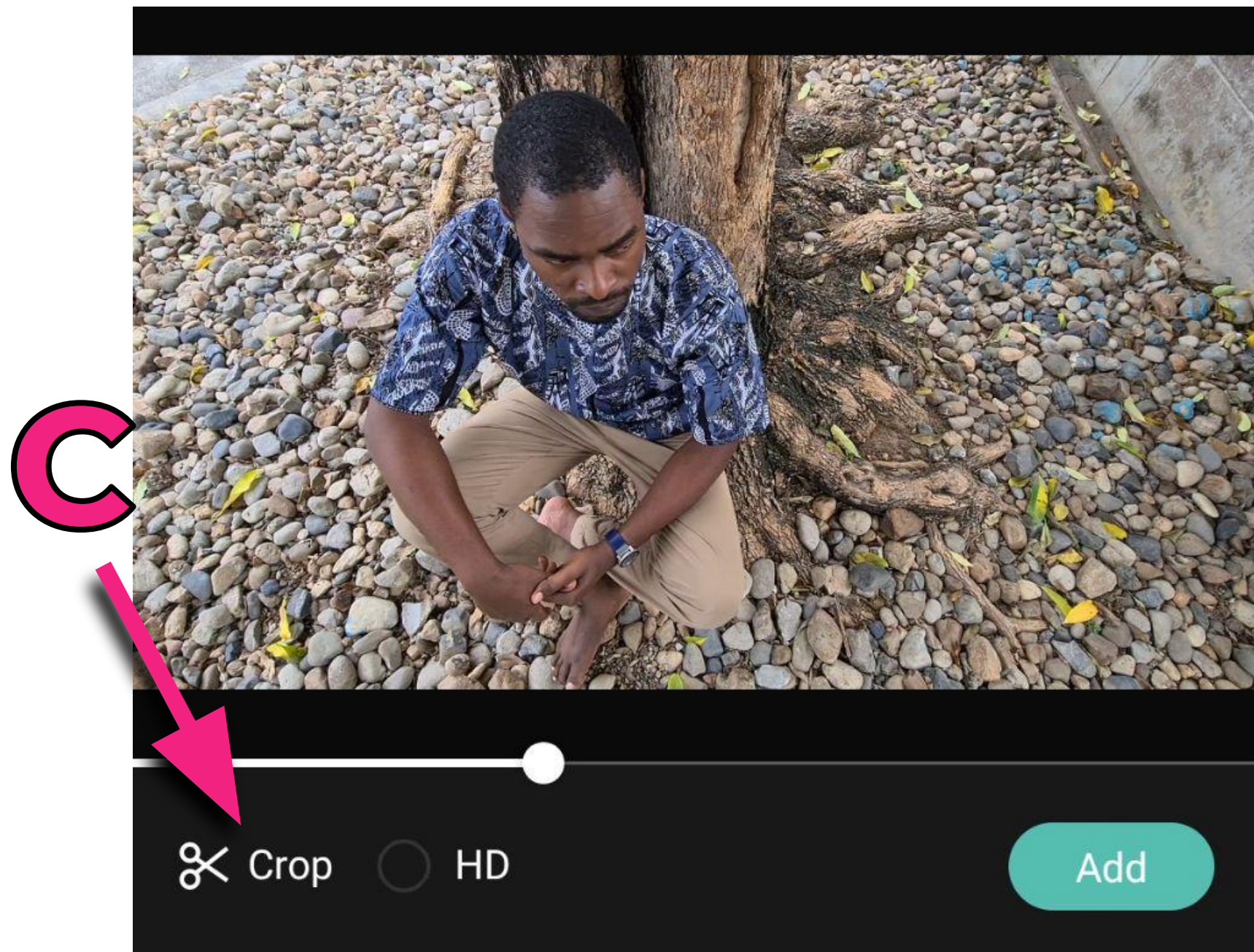

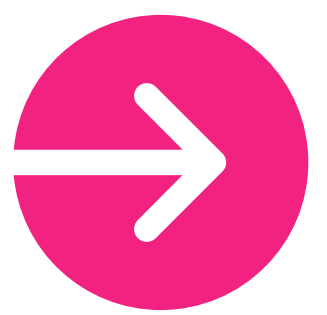
C. Select **Crop/Trim**

D. **Adjust** the yellow beginning and end markers to the portion you want to use.

E. Select the **✓** to confirm the crop.



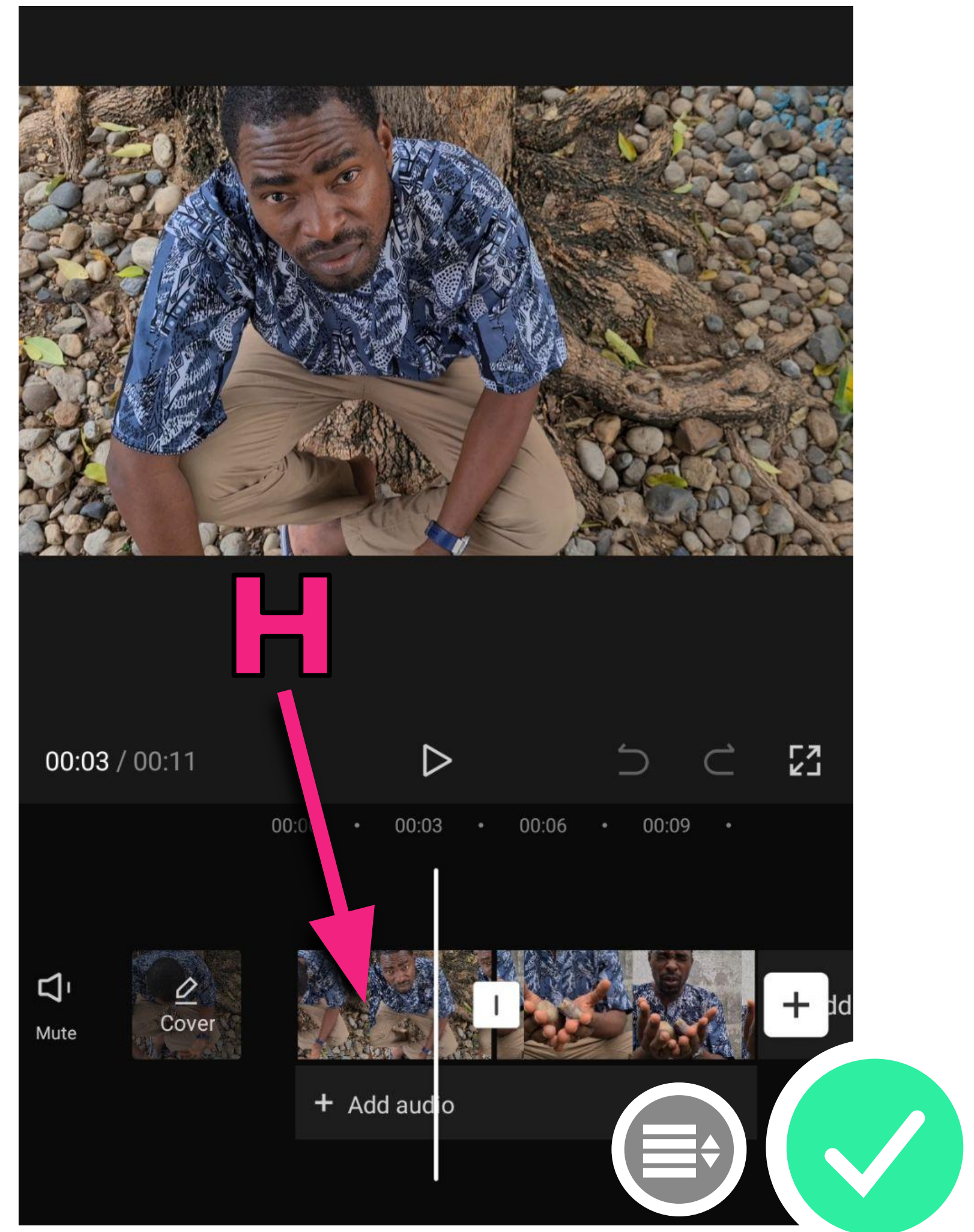
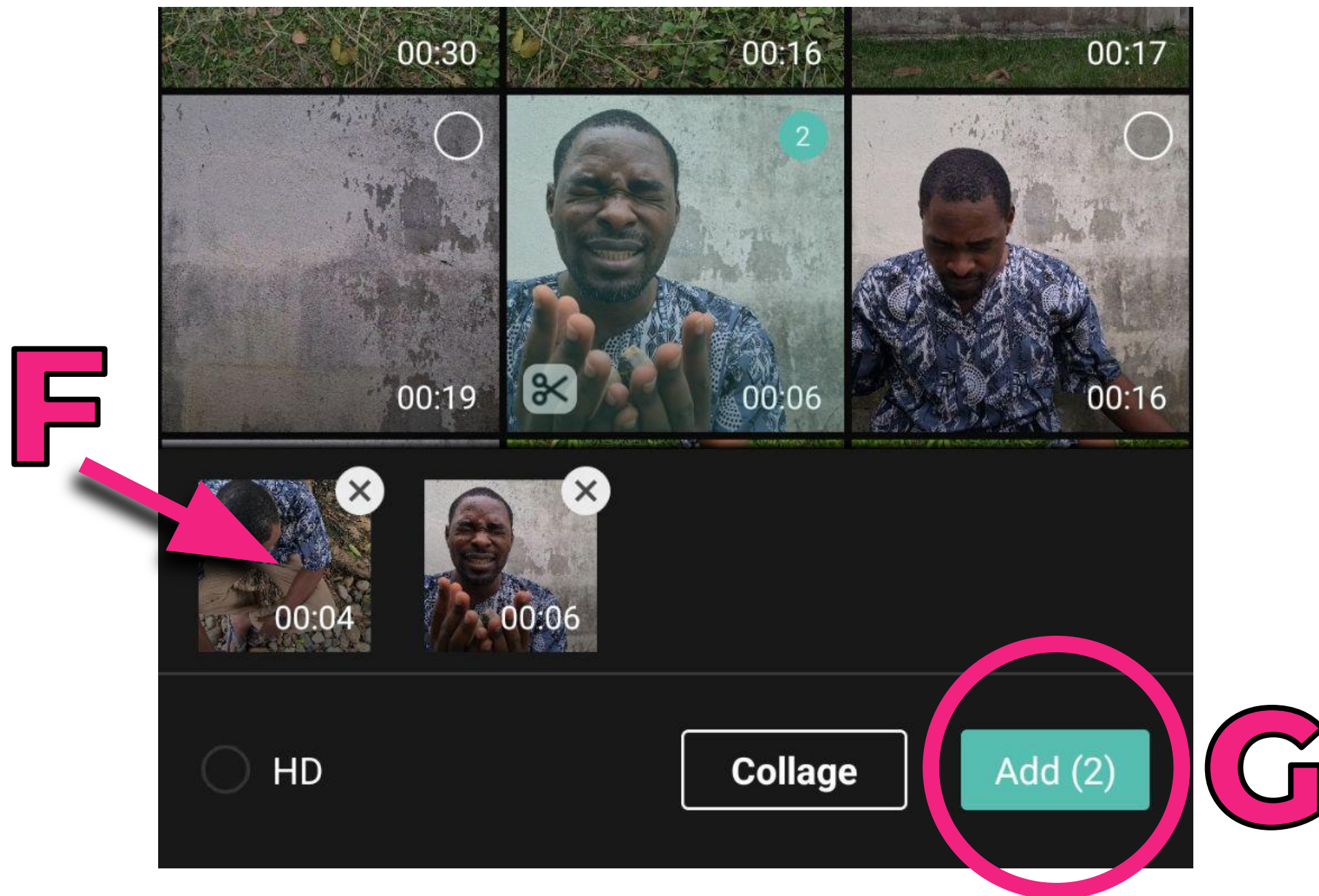

F. Your cropped clips will appear at the bottom. You may rearrange the order if you have more than one trimmed.

G. Then select **Add**

H. Your clips will appear in your timeline. 🎉

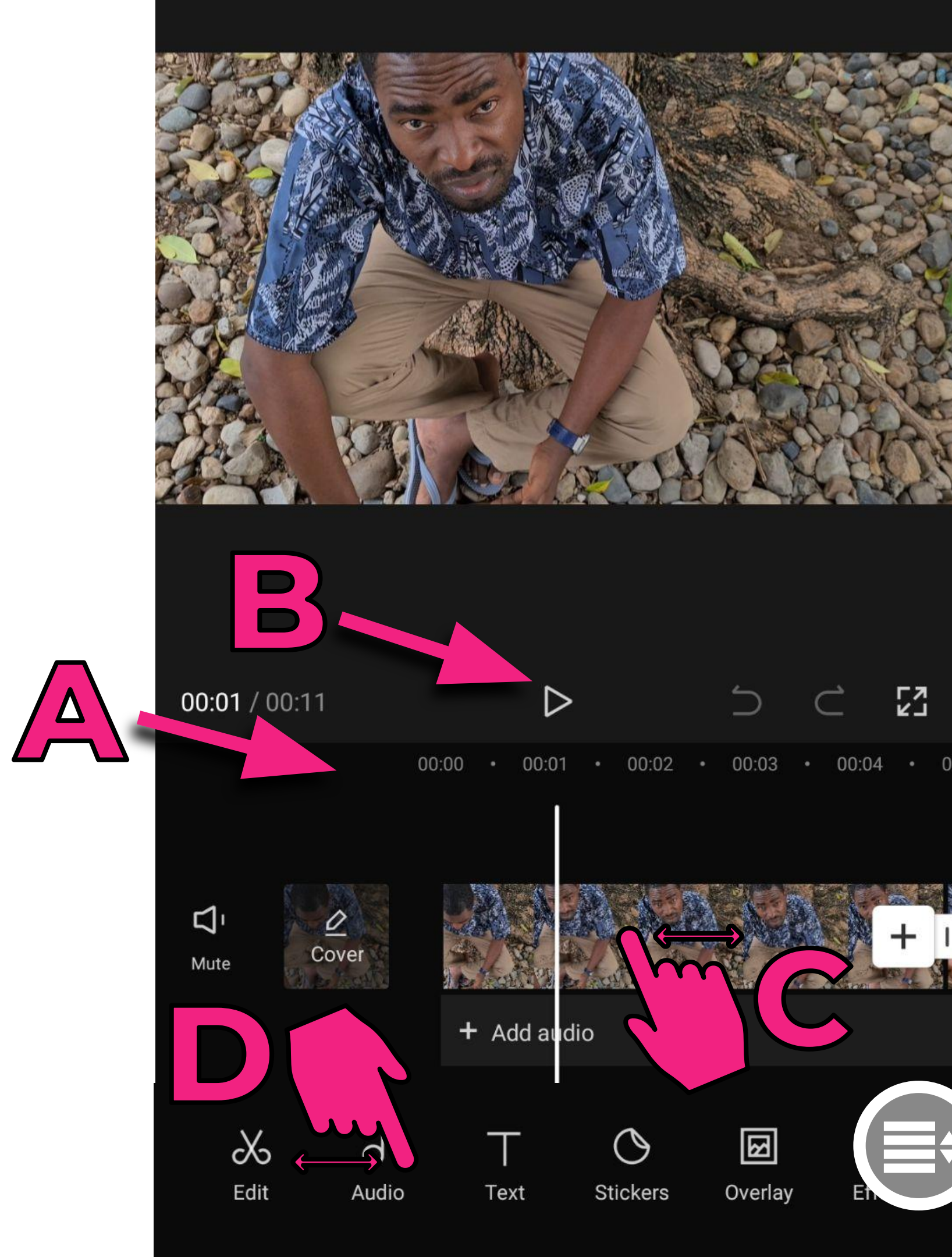
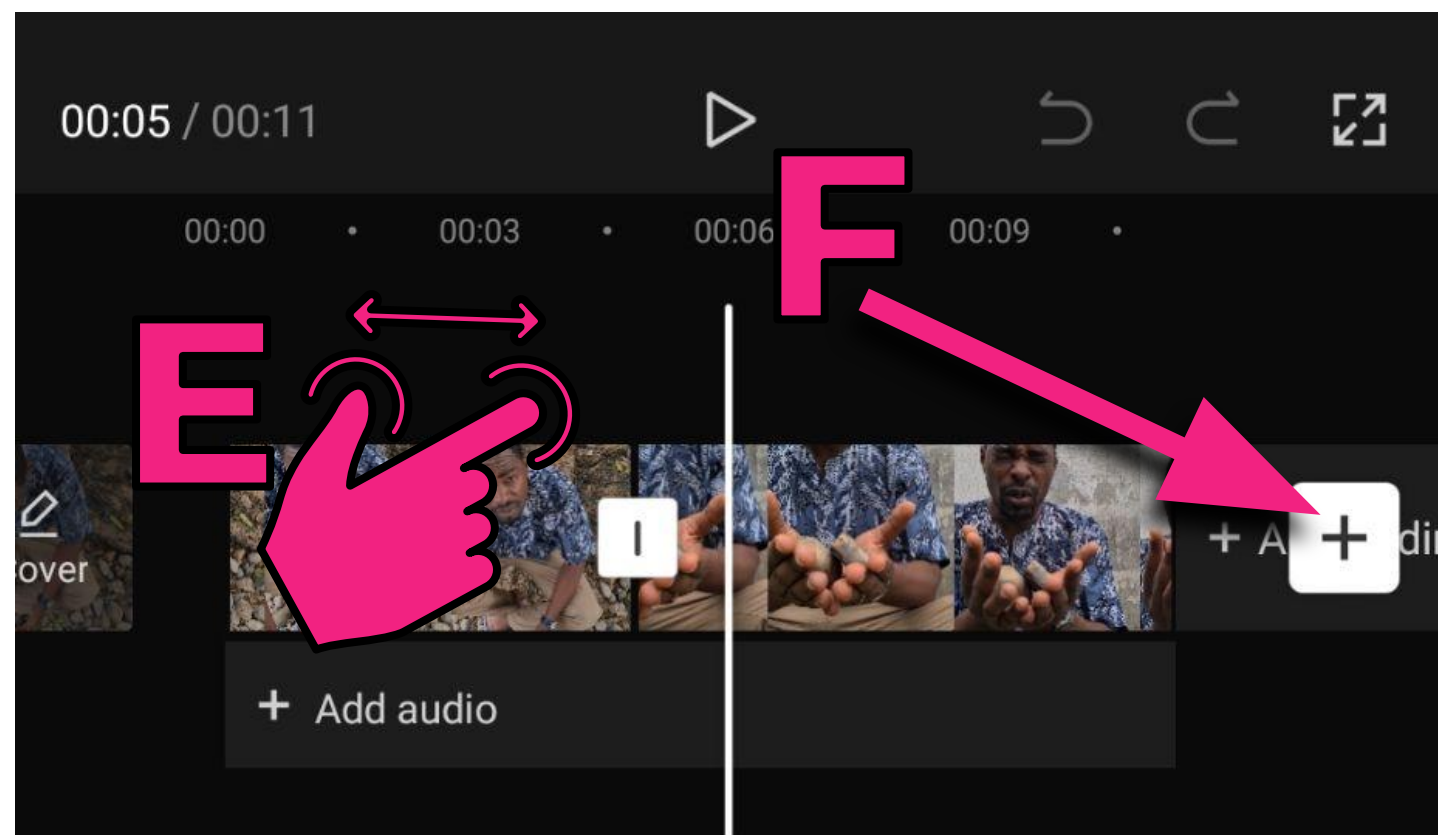


Navigating the Editing Timeline



2. Navigating the editing timeline

- A. This is your main editing timeline.
- B. Play button
- C. Scroll timeline
- D. Scroll Add Media Options
- E. Pinch to zoom timeline
- F. Add new clip

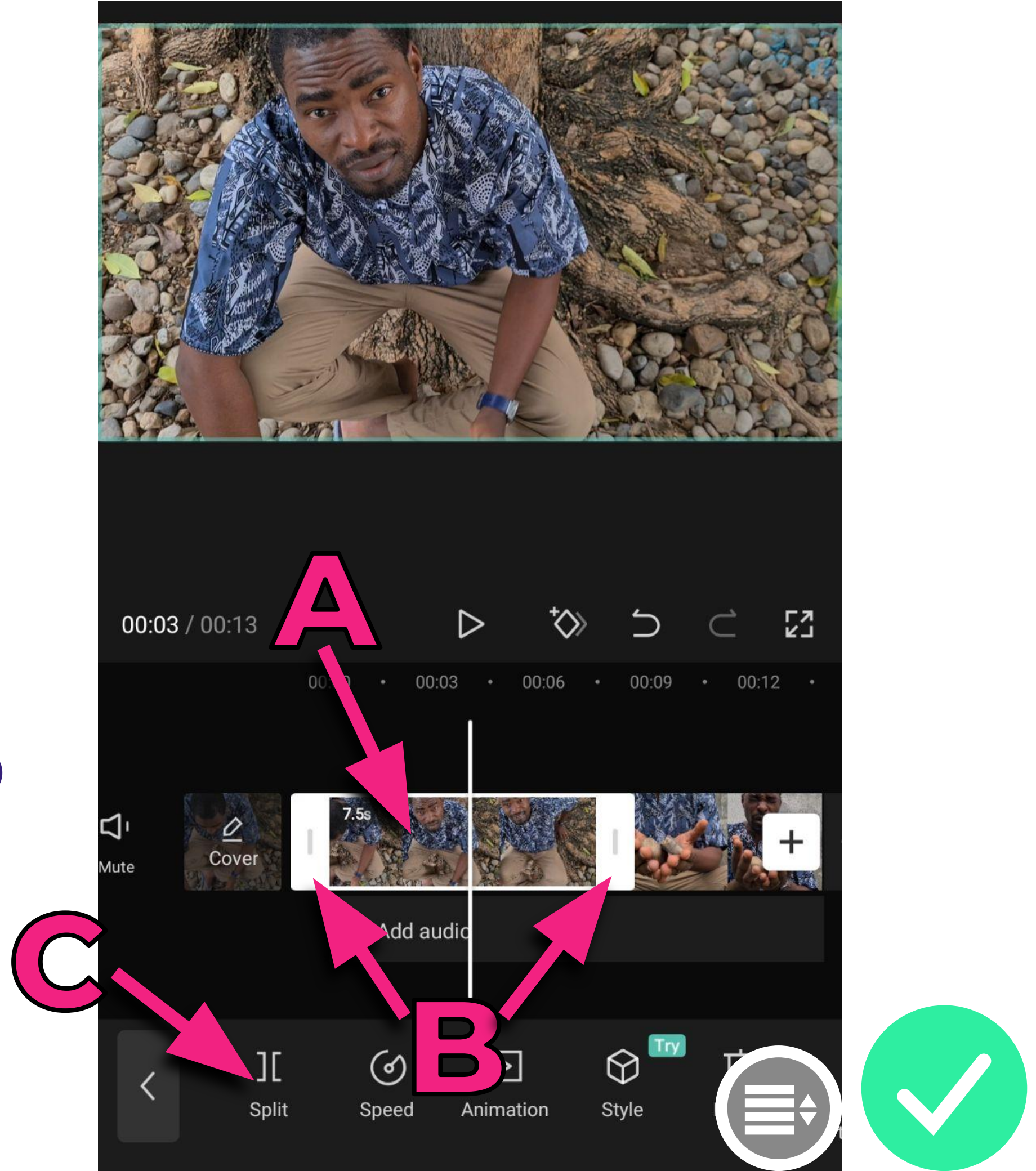


a. Adjusting the clip length

- A. Select a clip (a white border will appear around it.)
- B. Move beginning and end handles to desired length.

b. Split a clip in two

- A. Select a clip (a white border will appear around it.)
- C. click on split (clip will divide at center play line.)

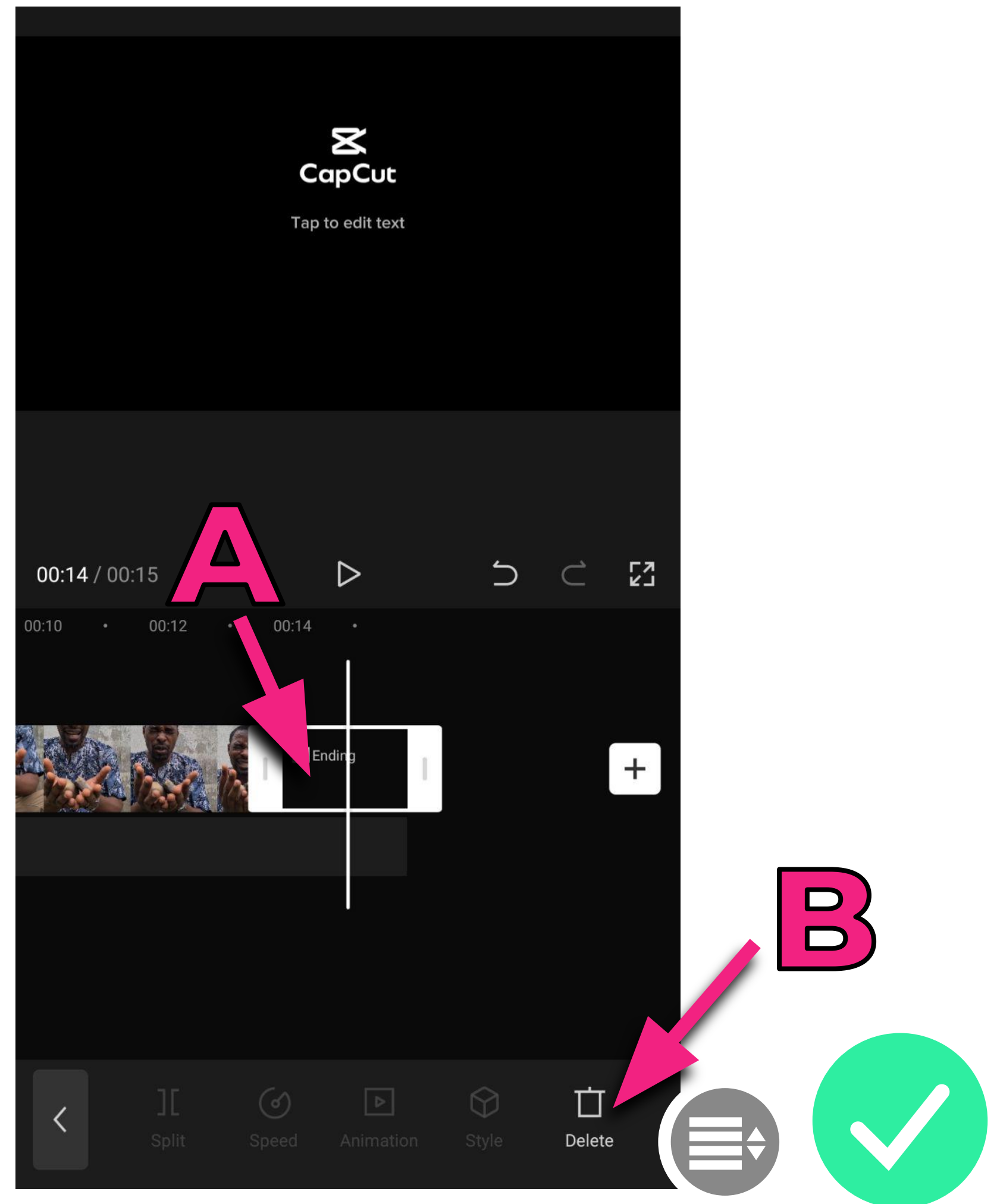
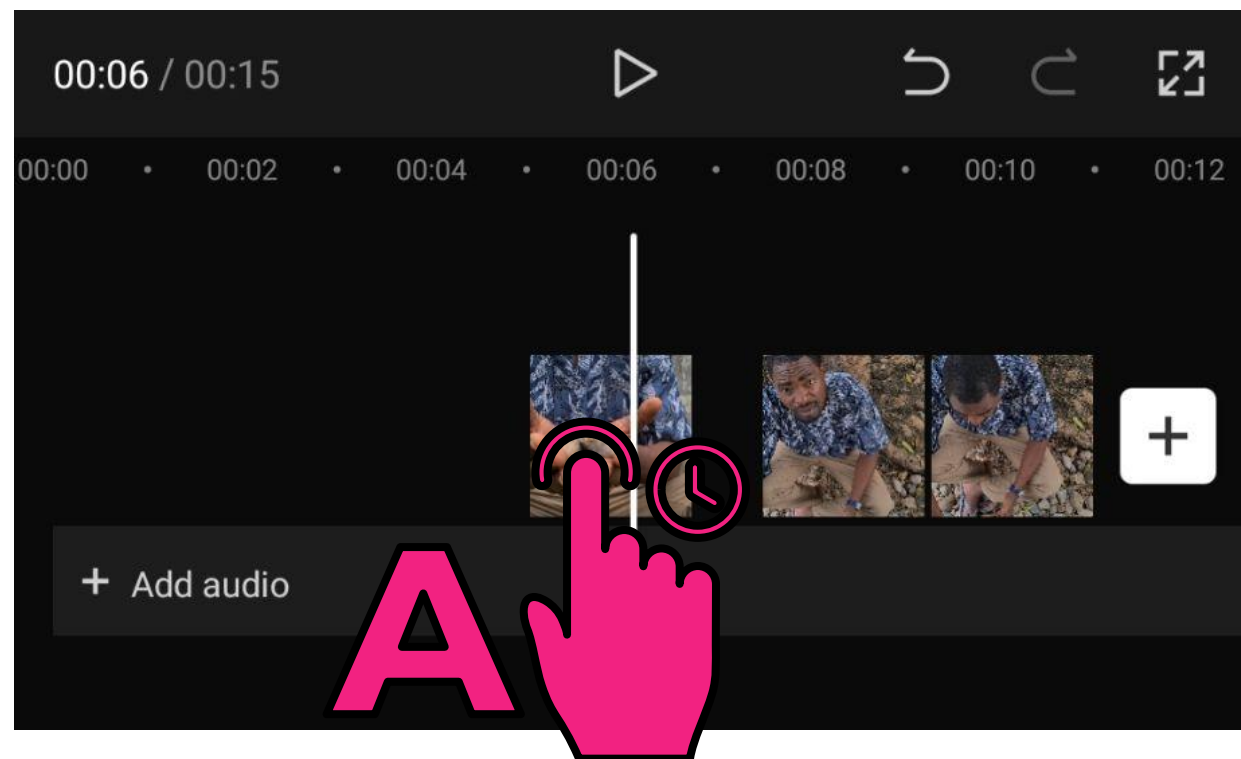


c. Remove CapCut ending

- A. Select the last ending clip
- B. Choose **Delete**

d. Rearrange clip order

- A. Long press and hold on clip to be able to change it's order

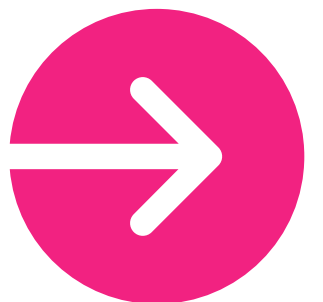
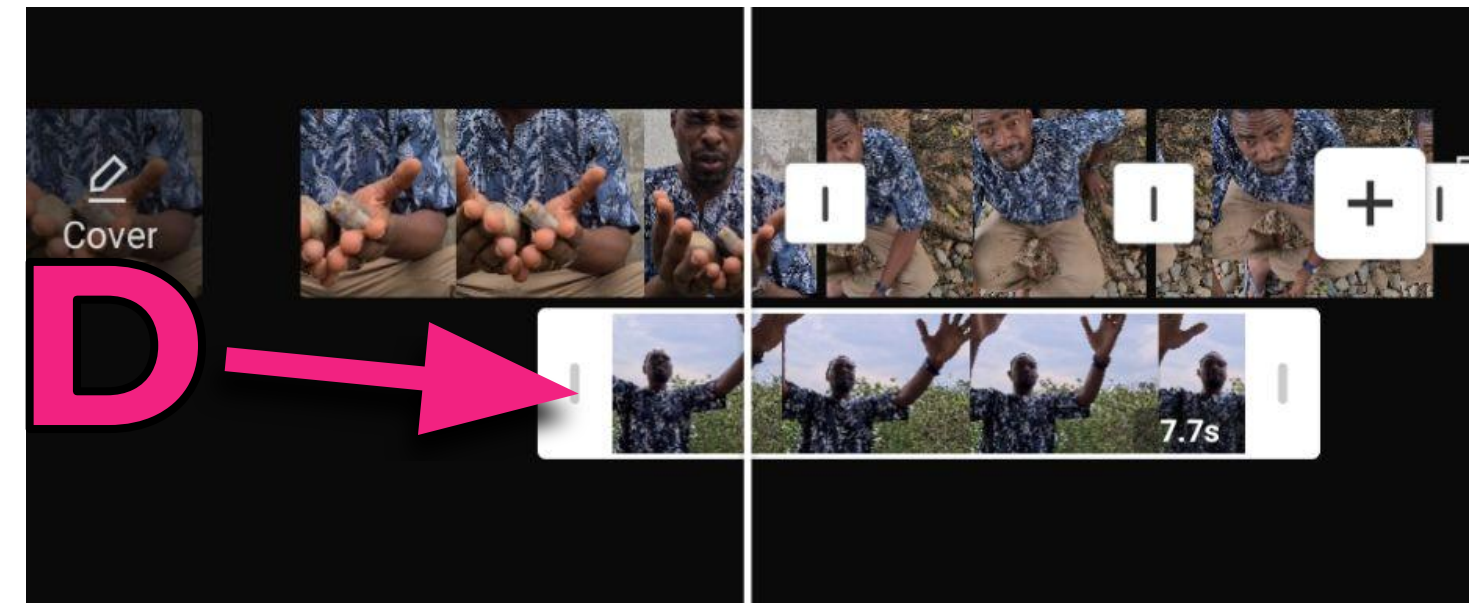
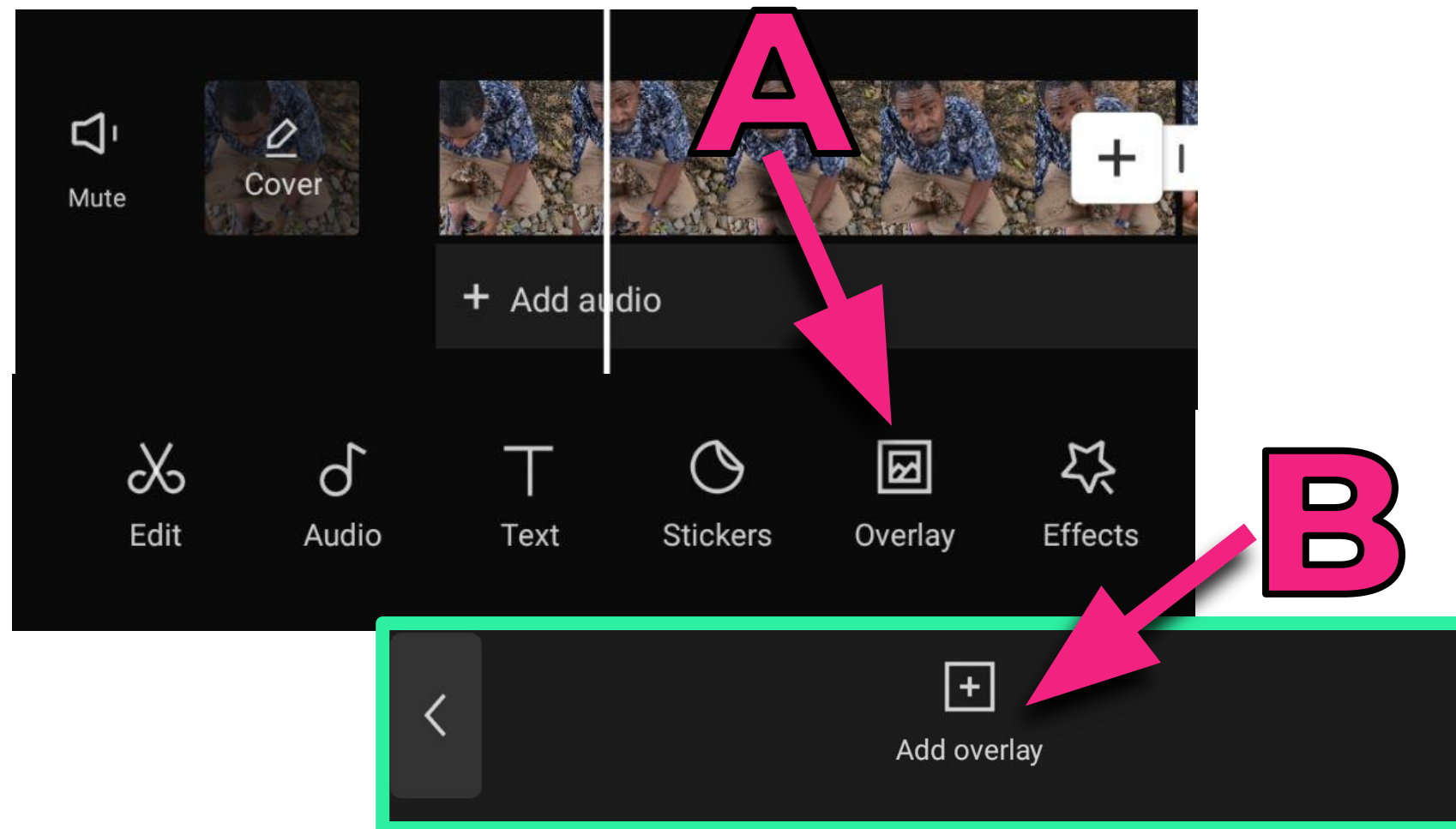
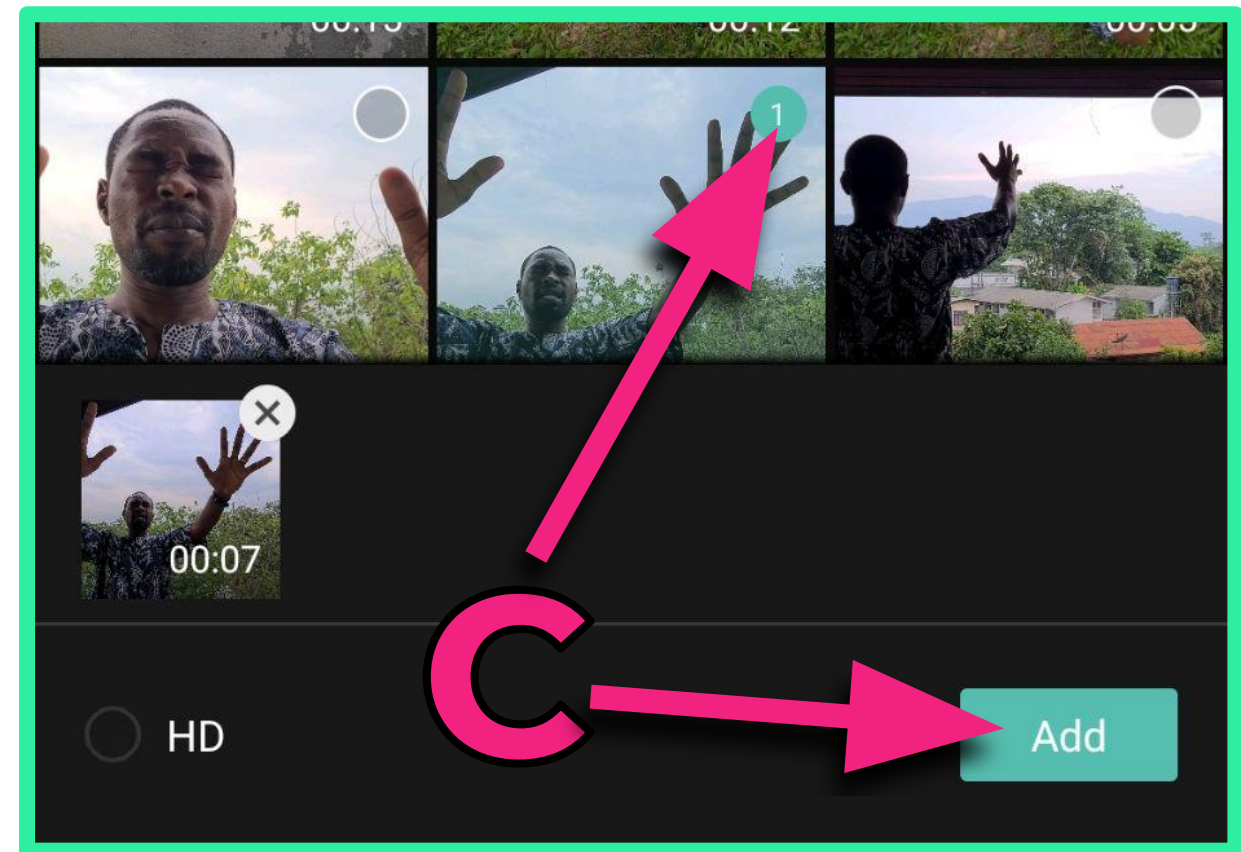


Text and Video Overlays



a. Text overlay

- A. To overlay a new video make sure no clip is highlighted and then select **Overlay**.
- B. Select **Add overlay**
- C. Select a **clip** and select **Add**
- D. Your overlay will appear below your other clips.

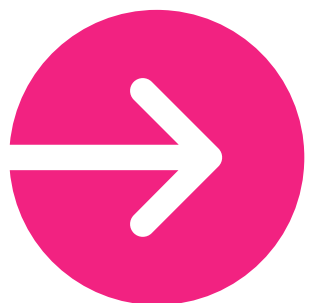
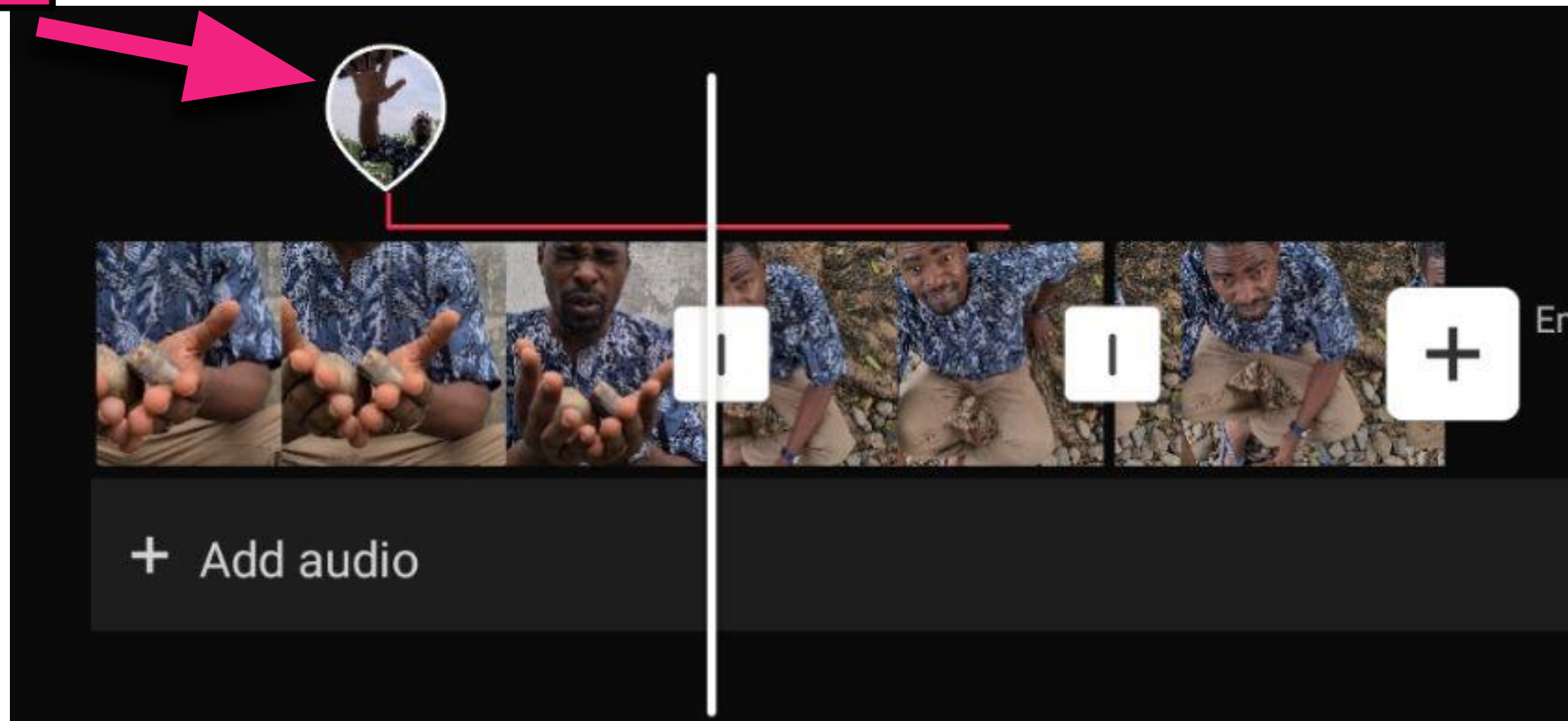
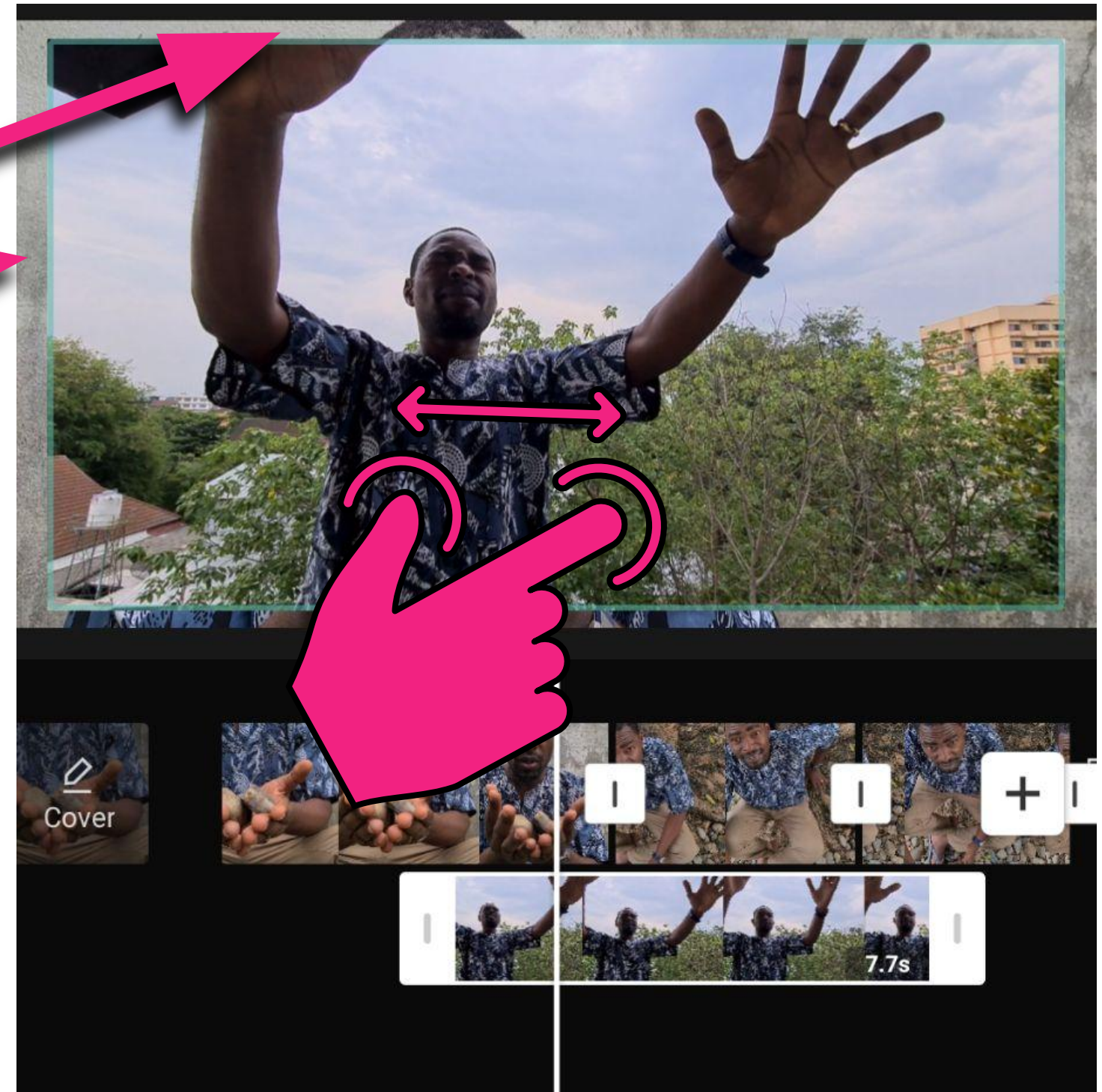


E. To fix a gap around your overlaid video **pinch and zoom** the video until it fills the screen.

F. When your overlay video is closed it will appear with a teardrop icon. Select the **teardrop icon** to re-open the overlay.

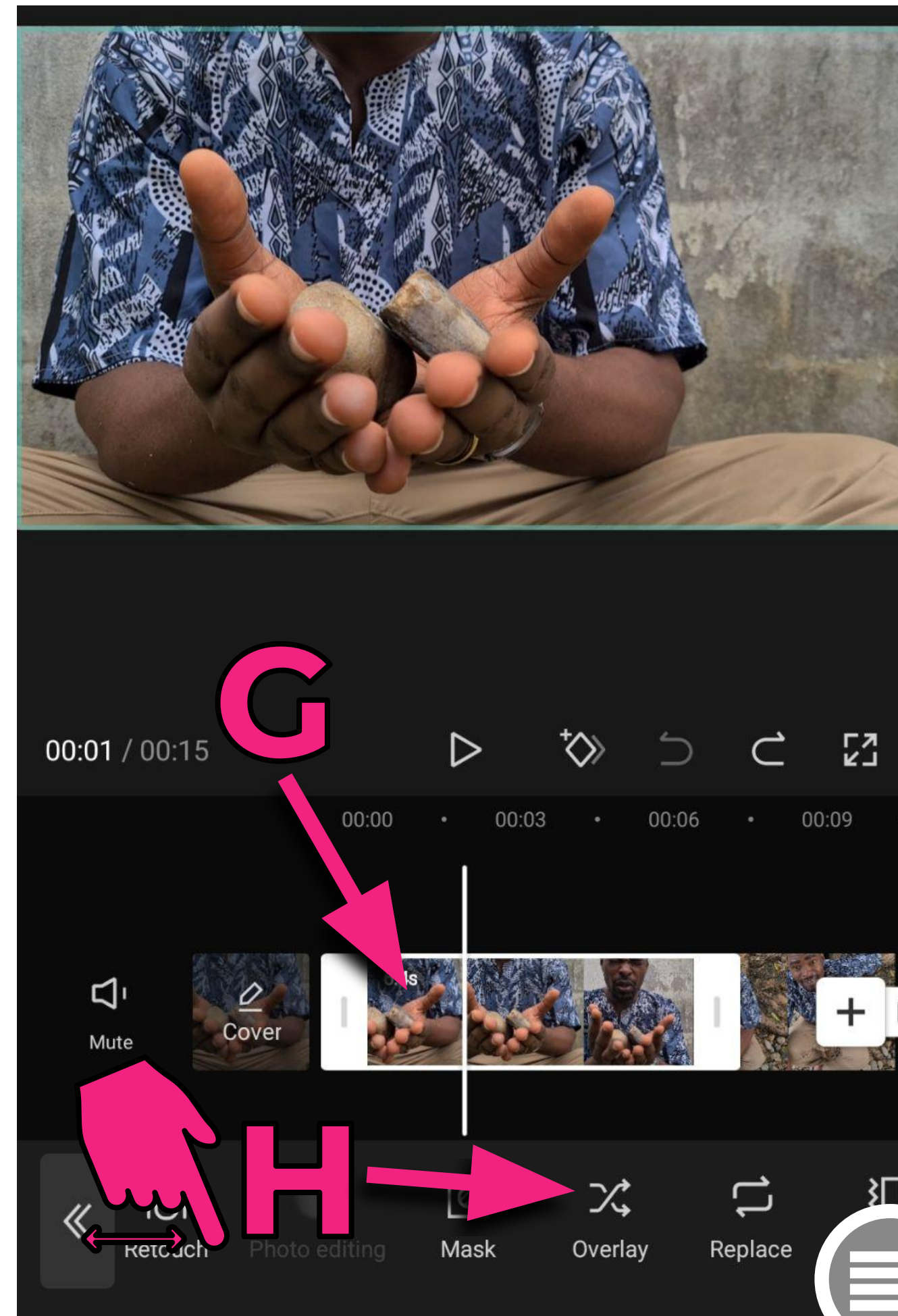
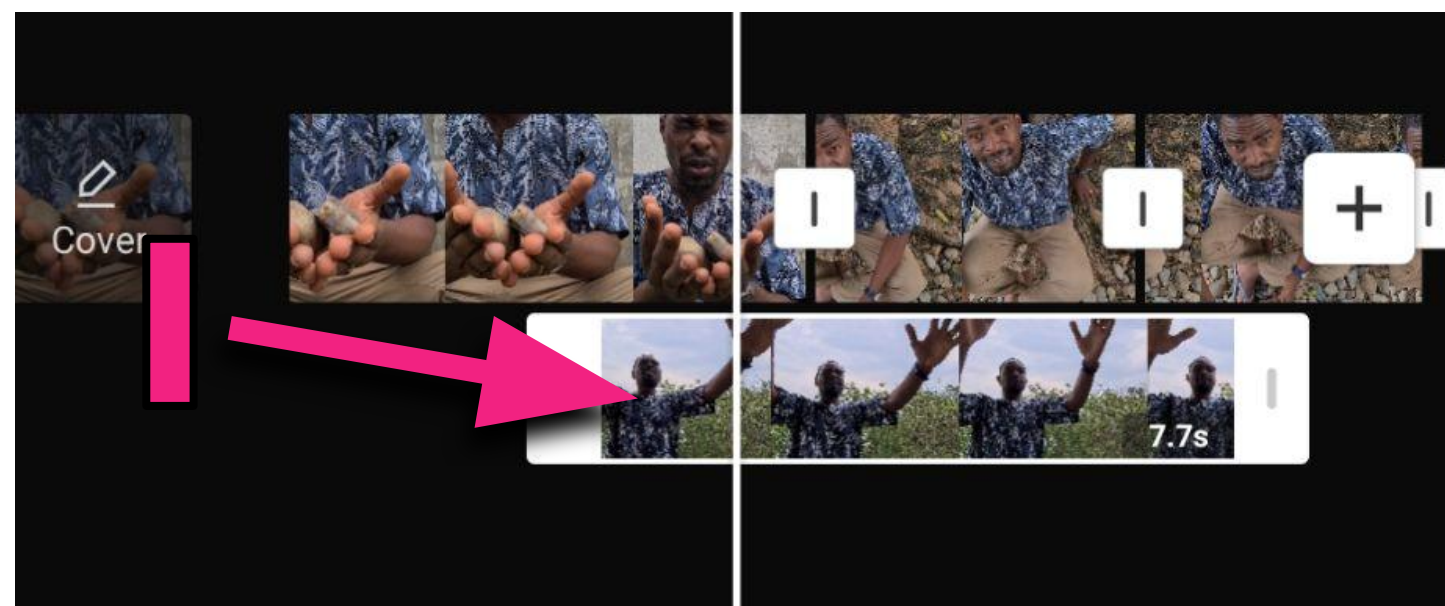

G. You can turn a video already on your timeline into an overlay by first selecting the video.

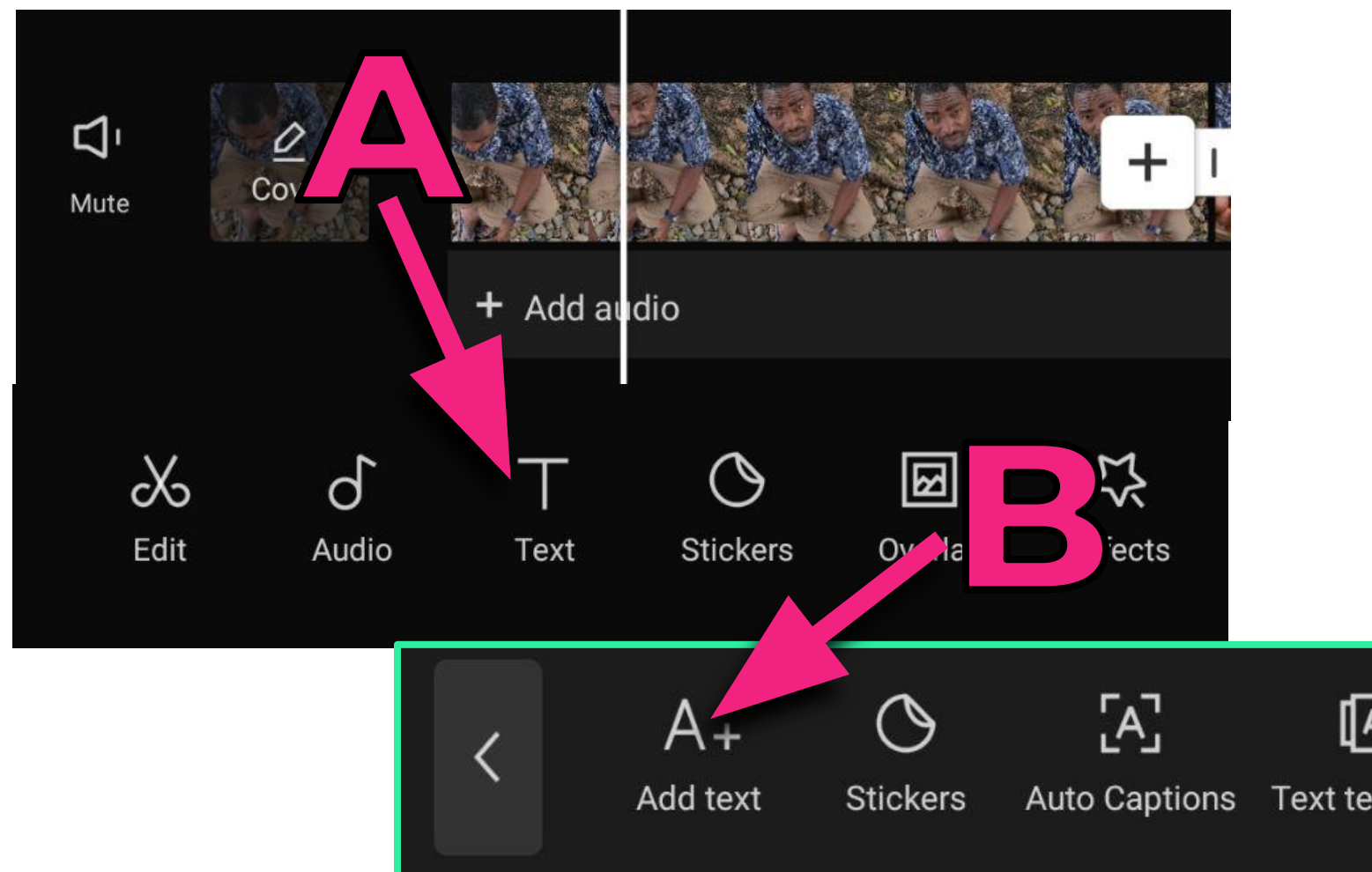
H. Then scroll the bottom options menu and select Overlay.

I. The selected video will then appear as an overlay. 🎉



b. Text overlay

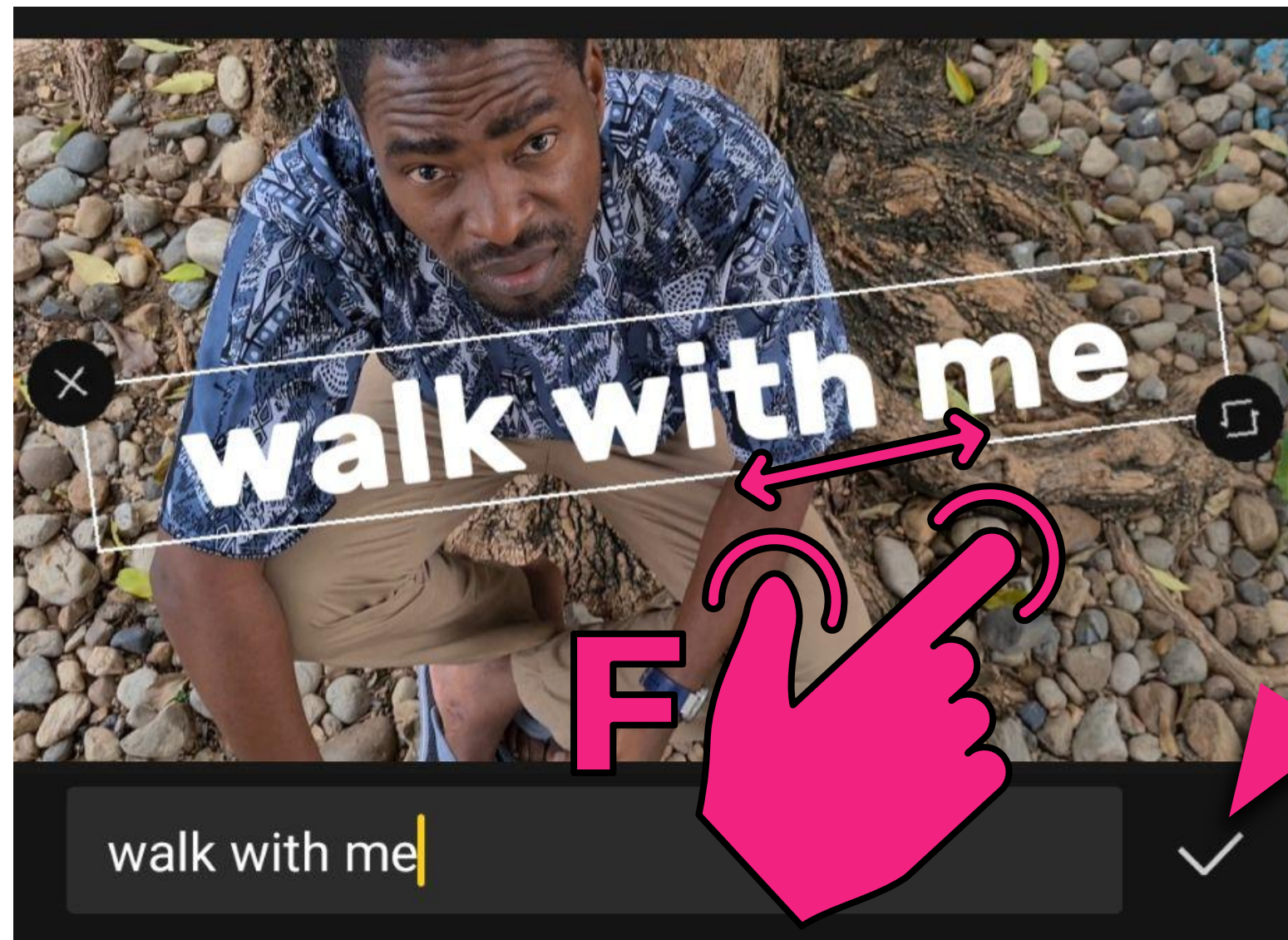
- To overlay text first, make sure no clip is highlighted and then select **Text**.
- Select **Add text**
- Enter your desired text
- Select **Font**
- Choose a font



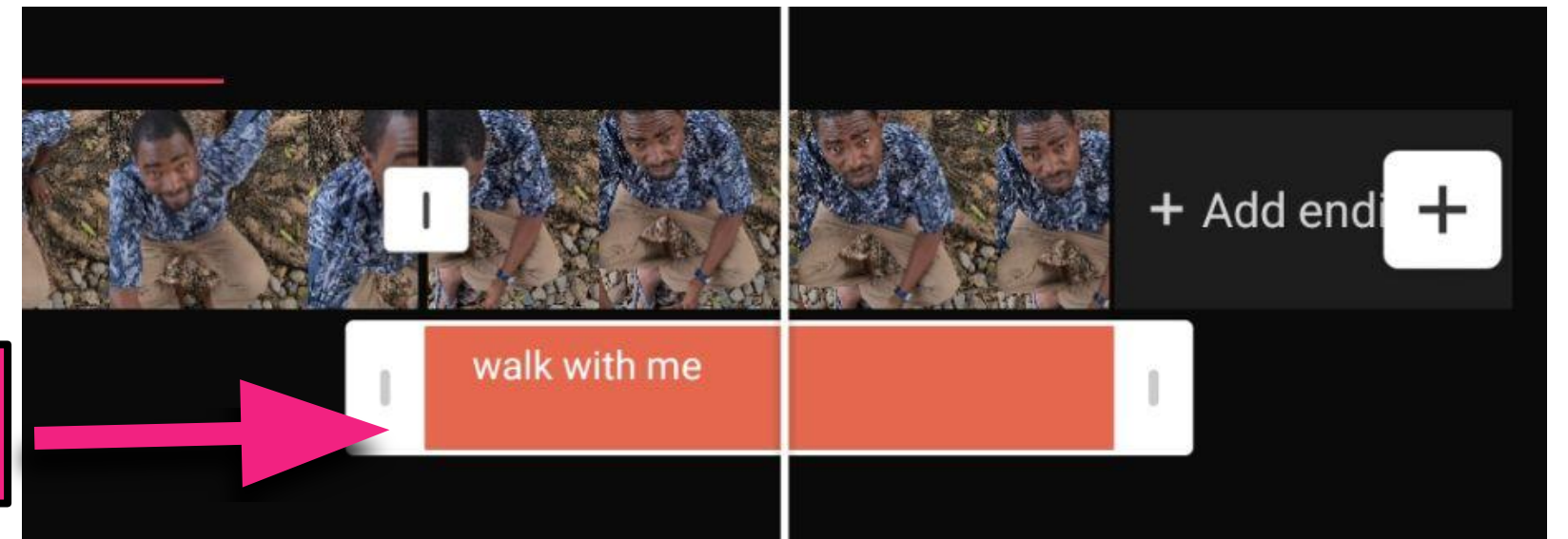
F. Pinch and zoom to make text bigger or smaller or to rotate the text.

G. Select the ✓ to exit the text editor.

H. You may now modify the length of the text like a normal clip.

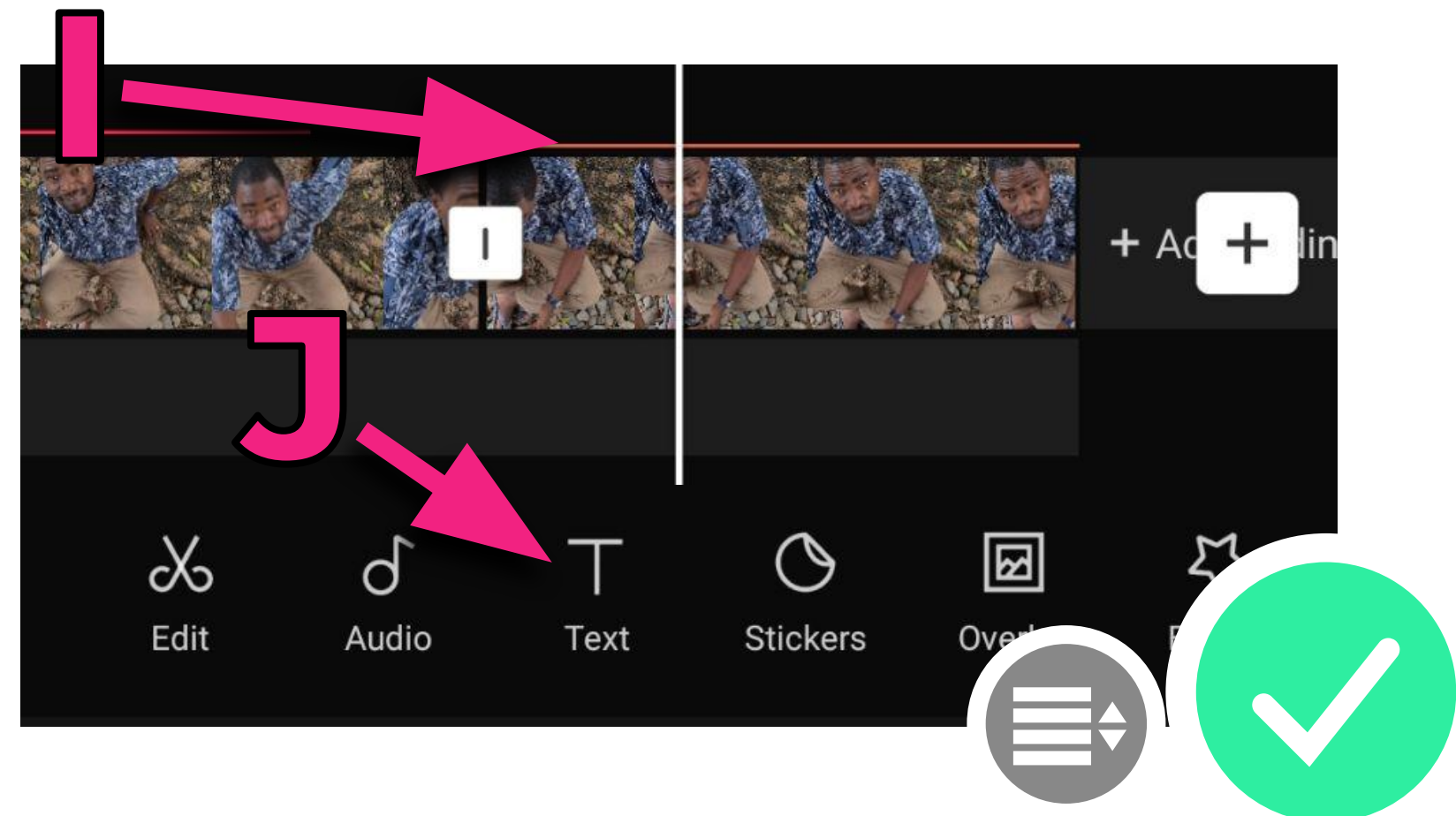

I. When the text editor is closed the text will appear as a line above the clips.

J. To edit it again select **Text**

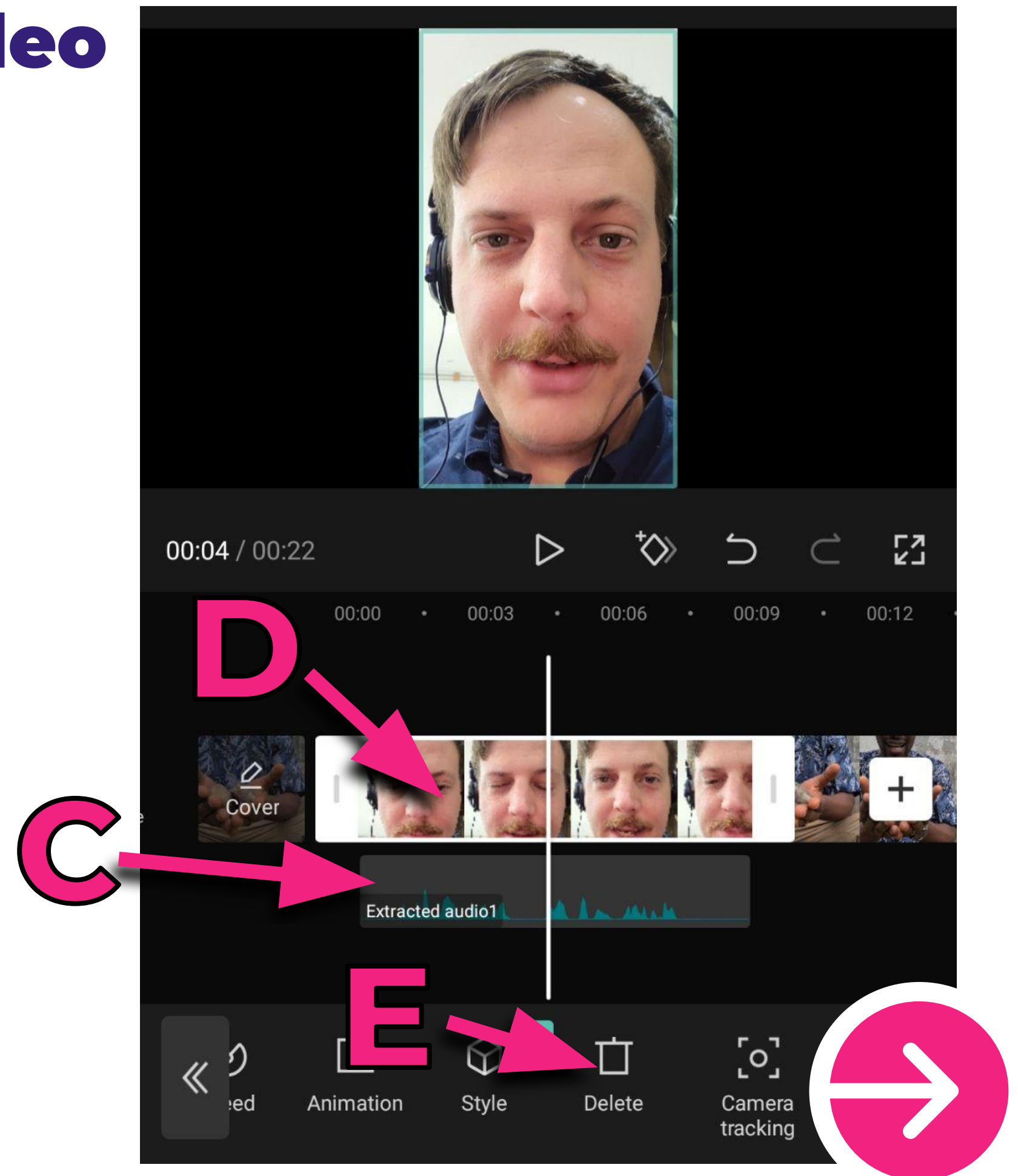
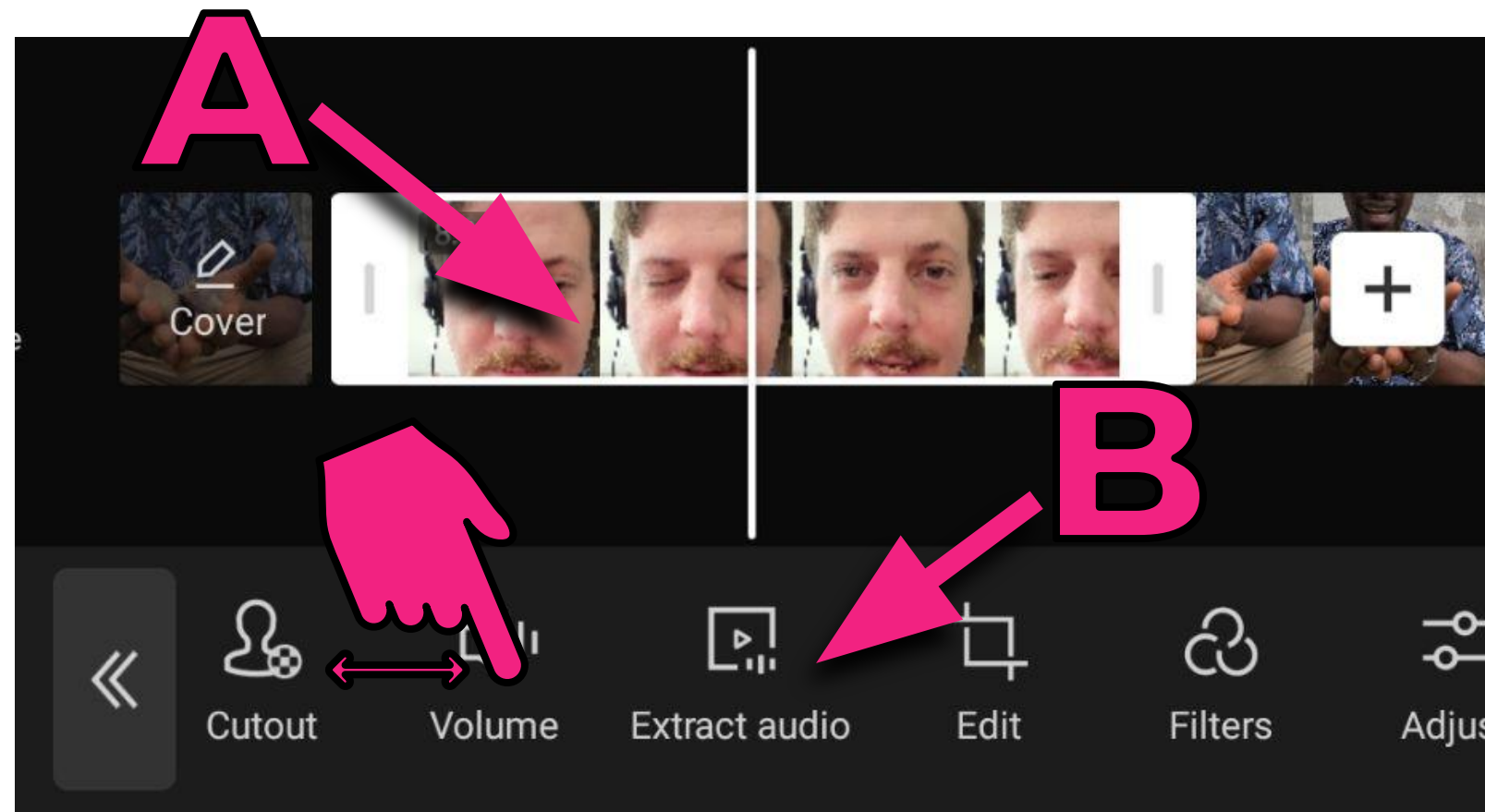


Audio Editing

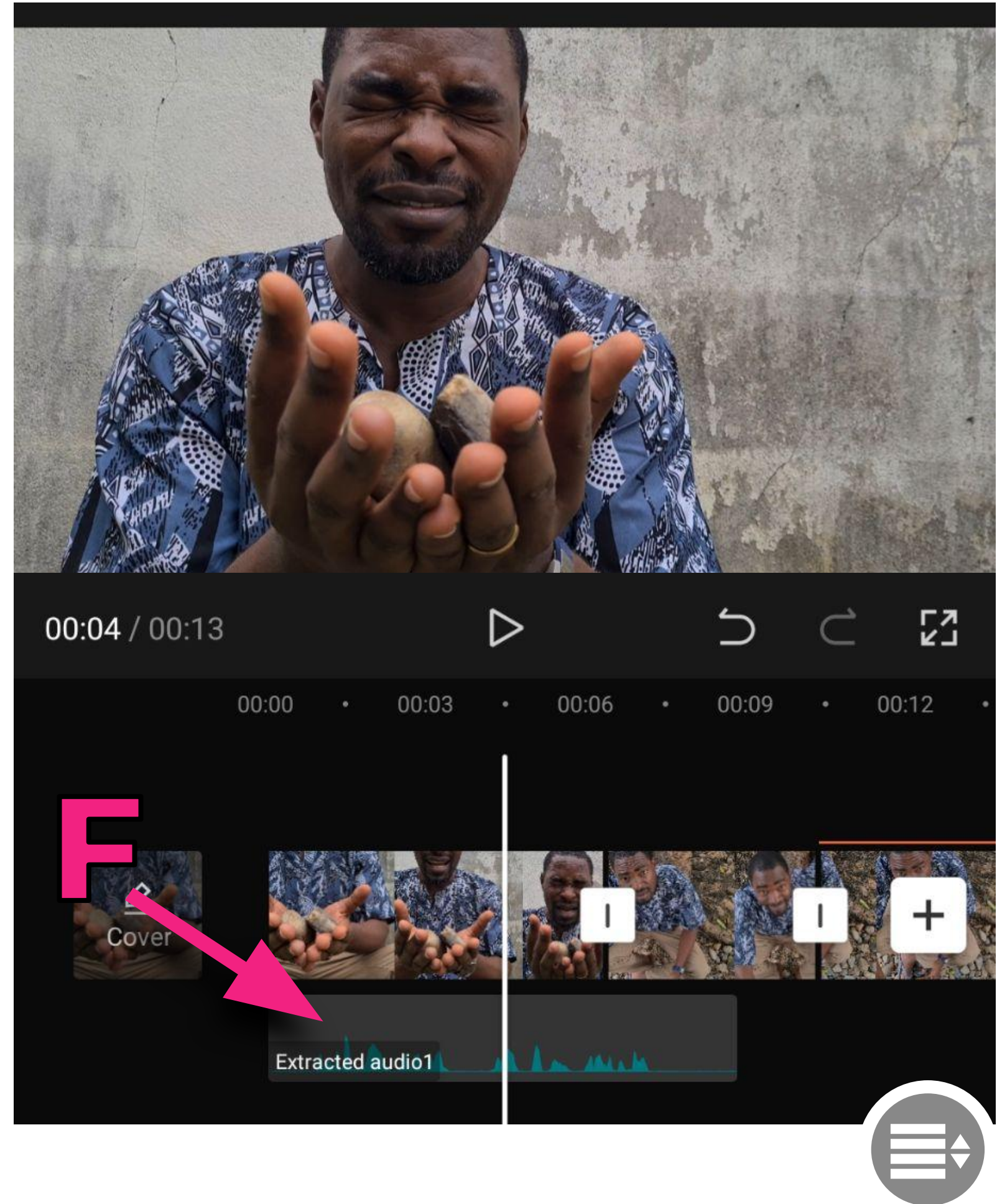


a. Extracting audio from a video


- First select the clip you want to separate the video from the audio.
- Select **Extract audio**.
- Your audio will now appear under your video.
- Select the video track
- Select **Delete**

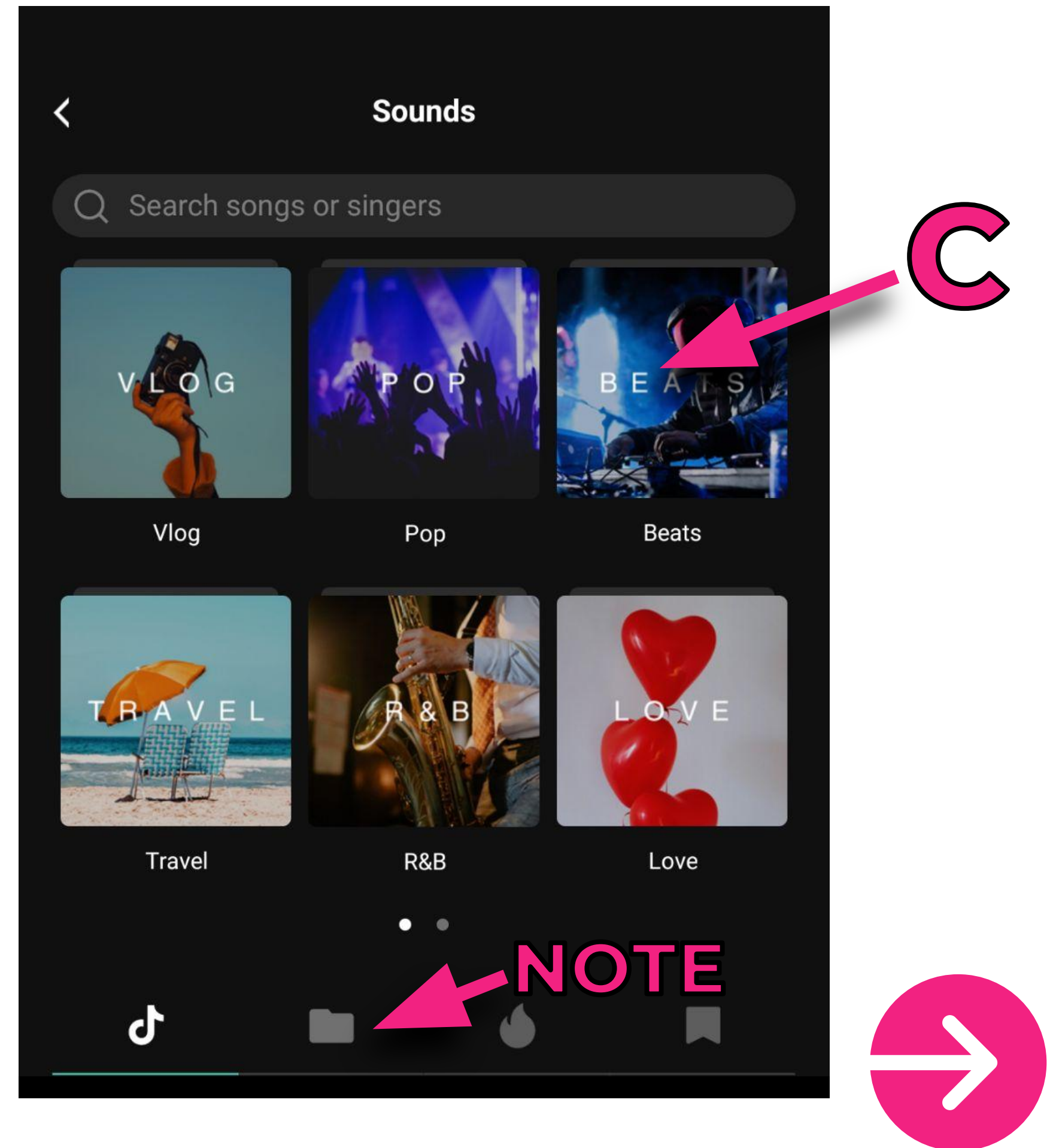
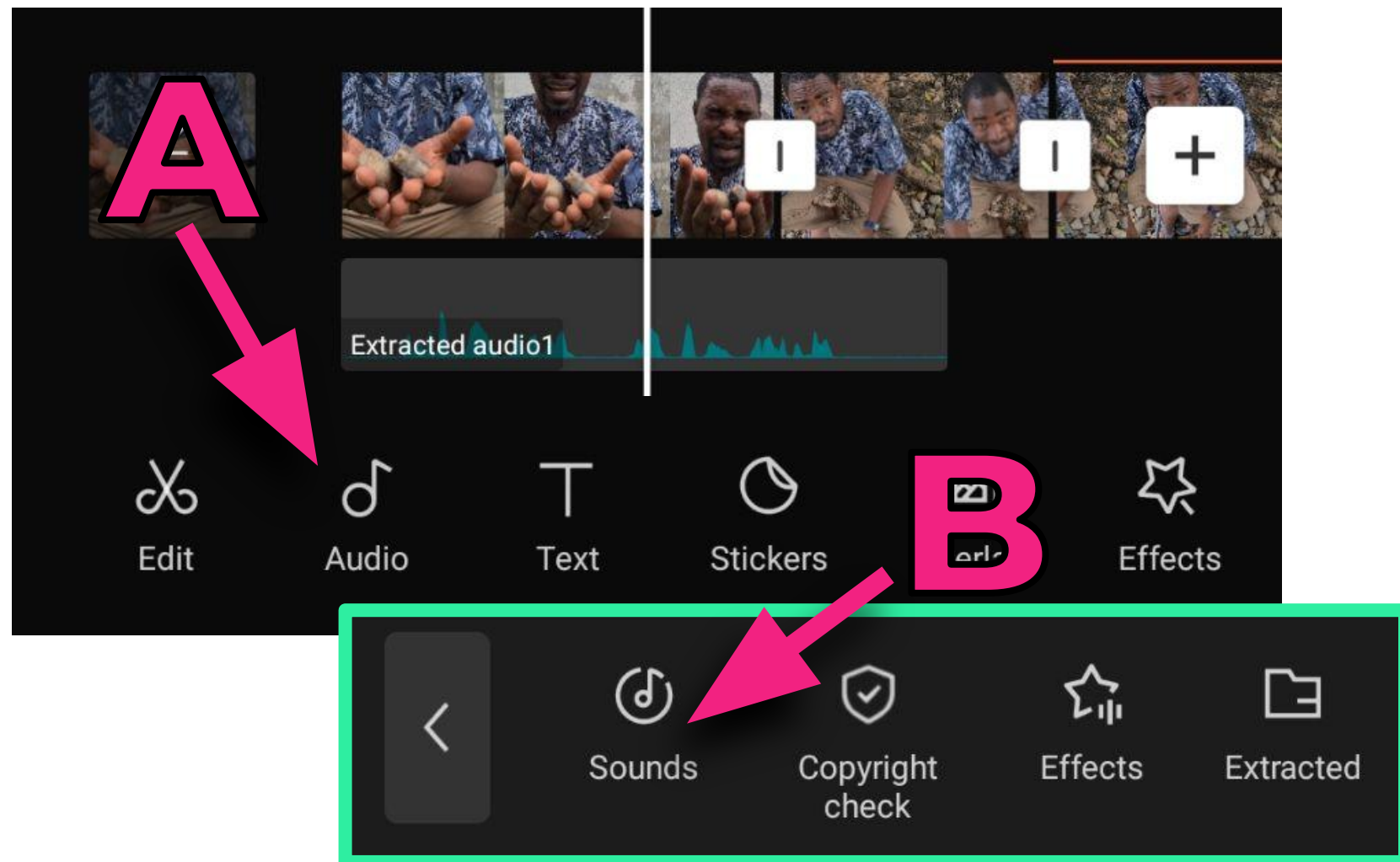


F. The audio will now appear underneath your other video clips. You can now edit it like a normal clip. 🎉



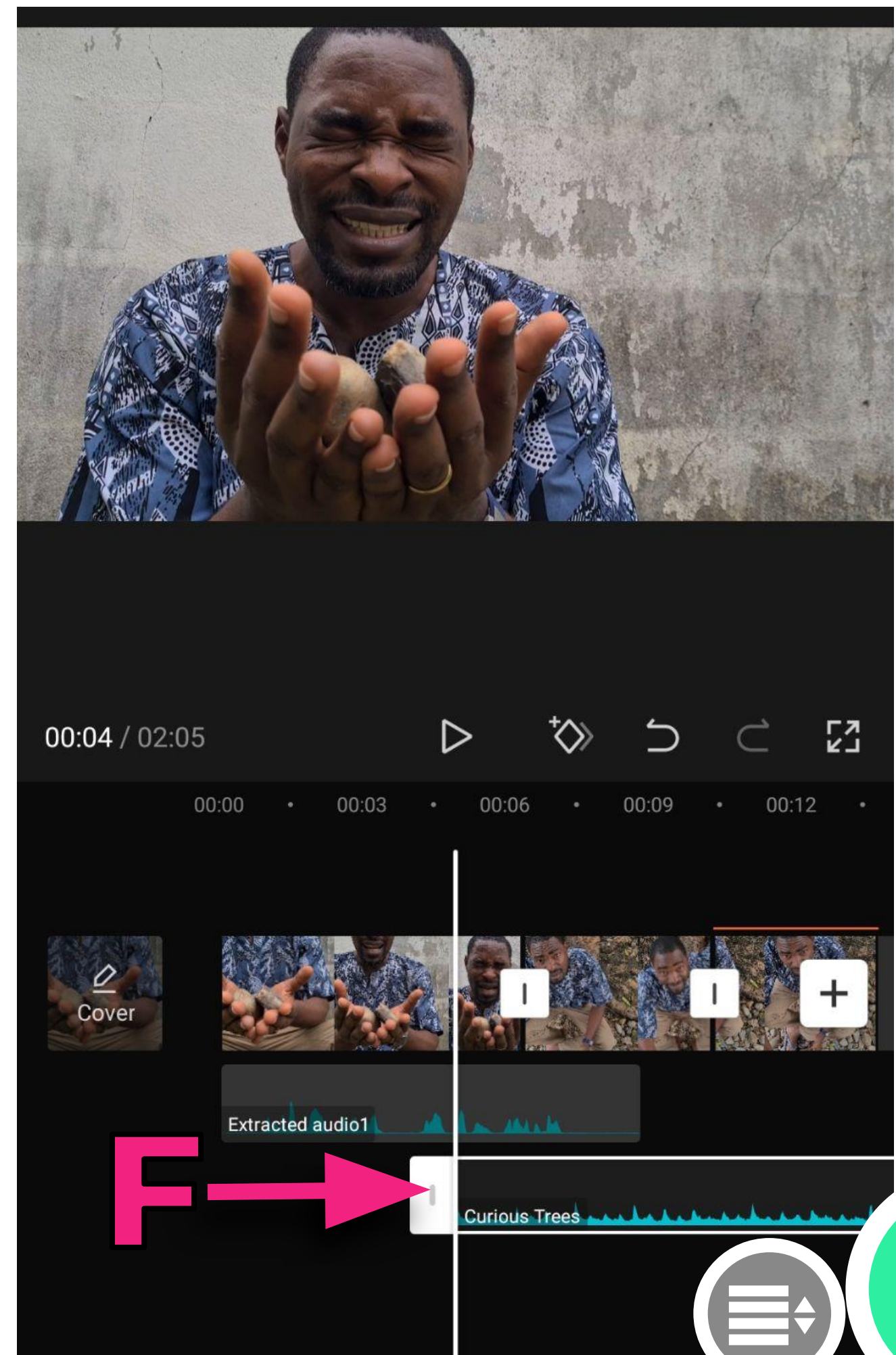
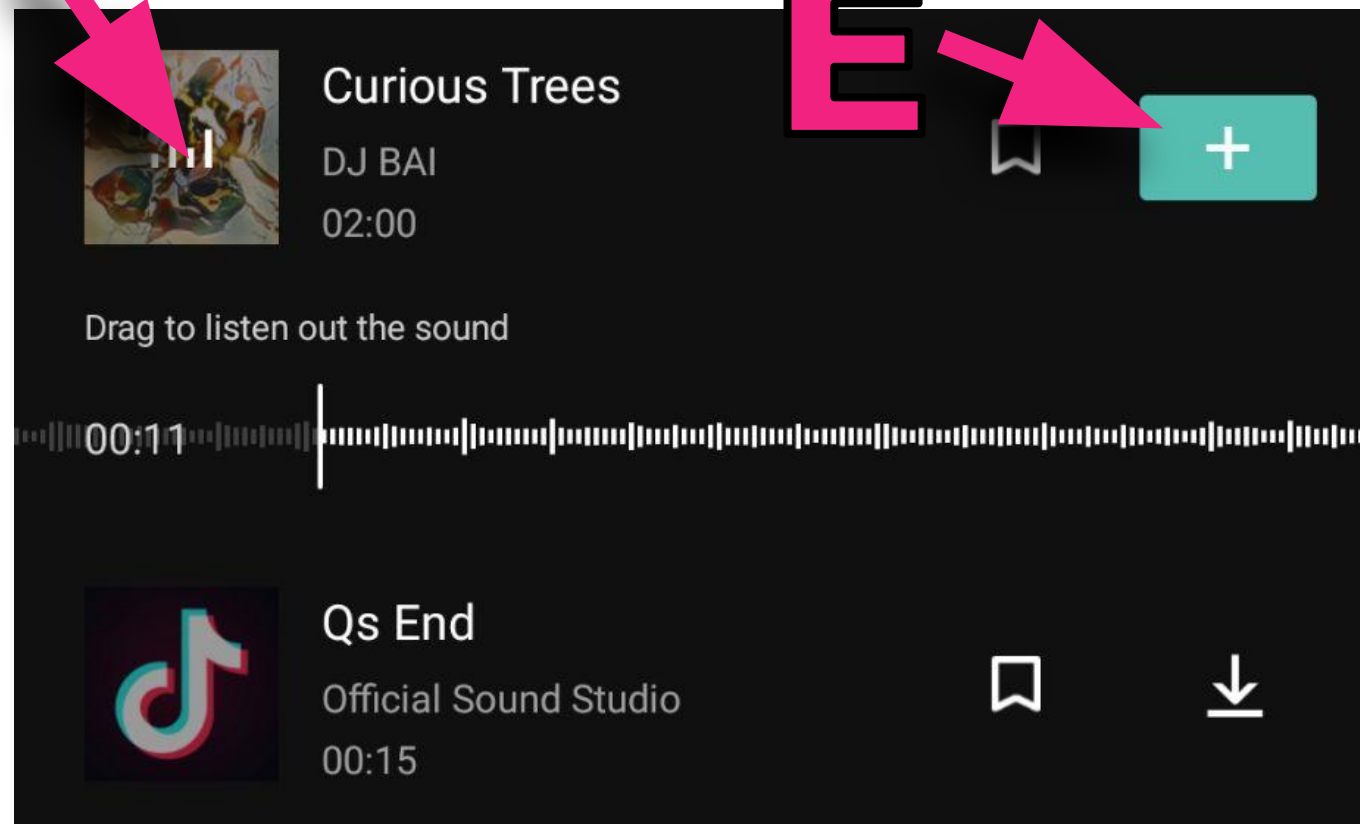
b. Adding music

- A. Make sure no clip is highlighted and then select **Audio**.
 - B. Select **Sounds**
 - C. Select a style of music from the options below. (internet required)
- NOTE: You can audio files on your phone by selecting the  icon.



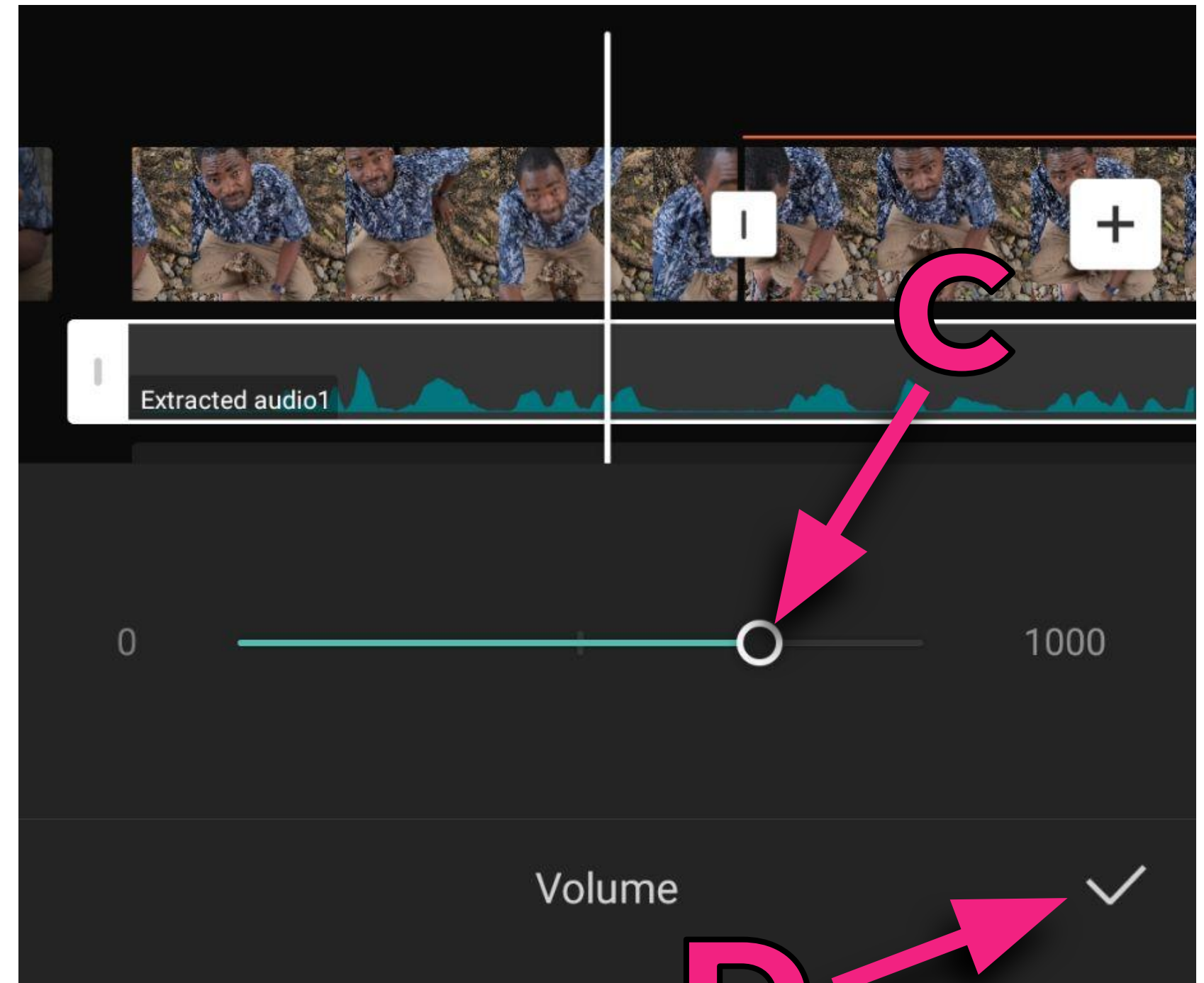
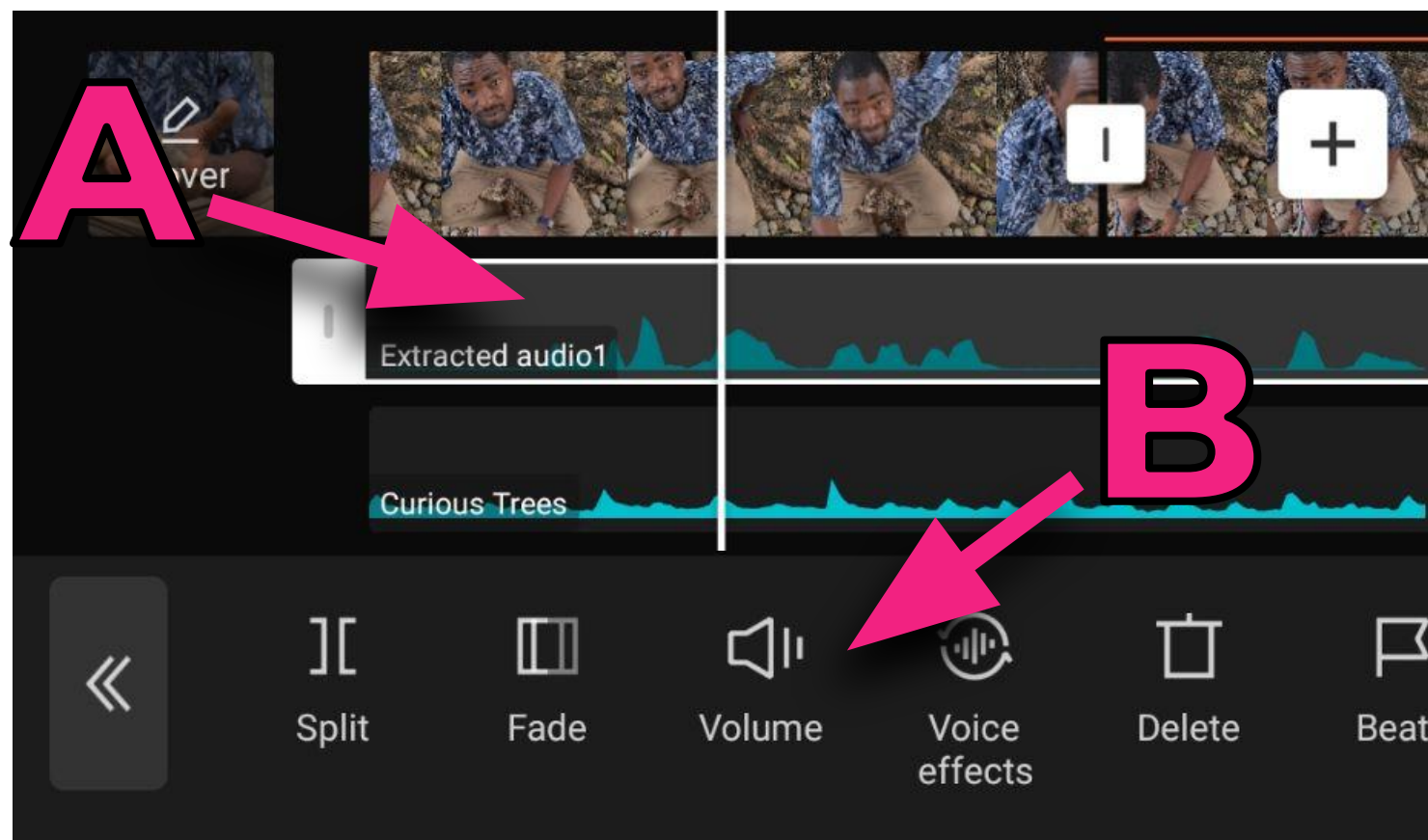
D. Click on a track to listen to it.
E. If you like that track select the
+ Button
F. The music track will appear
below your video and other audio
tracks. 🎉

c. Adjusting volume

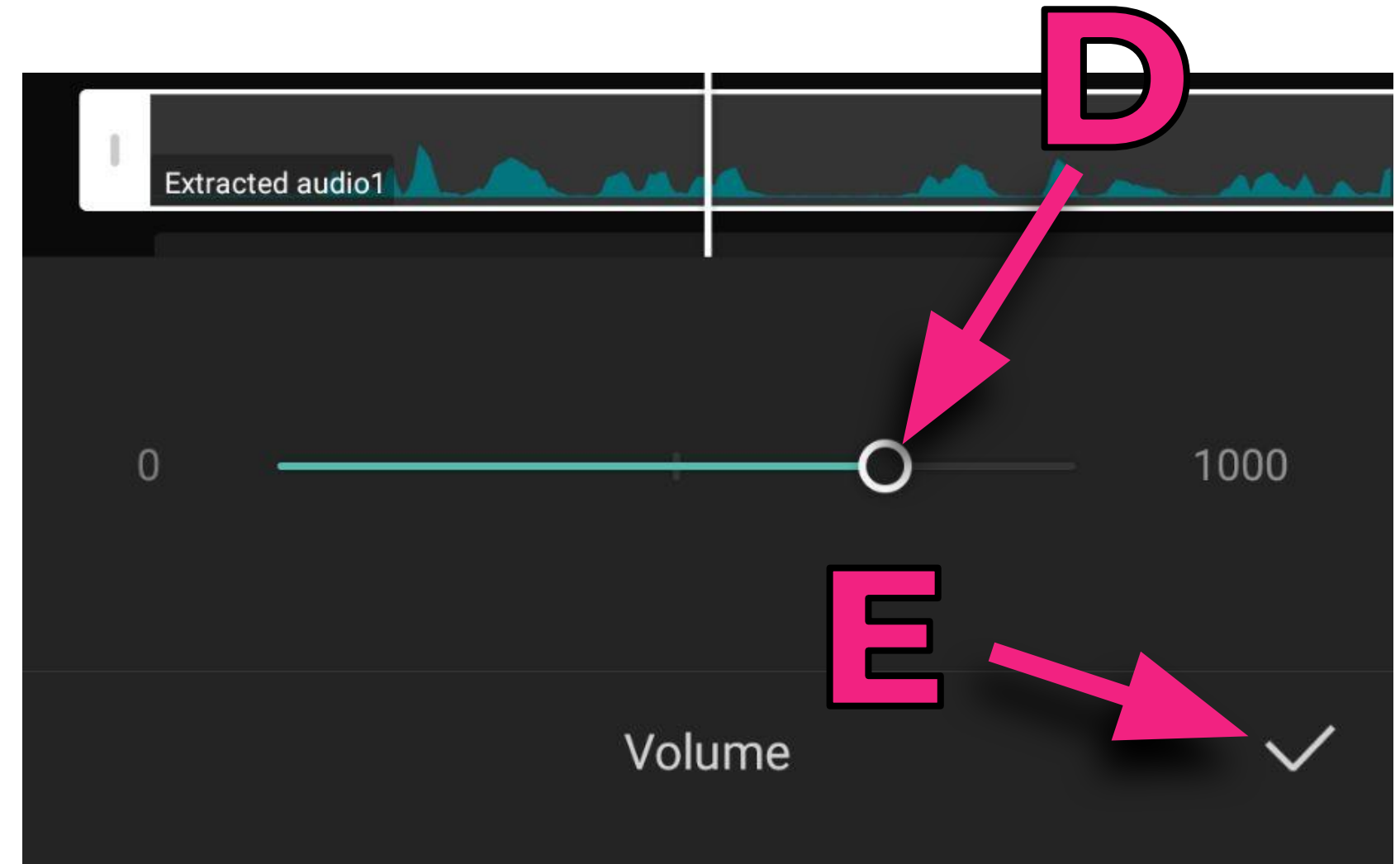
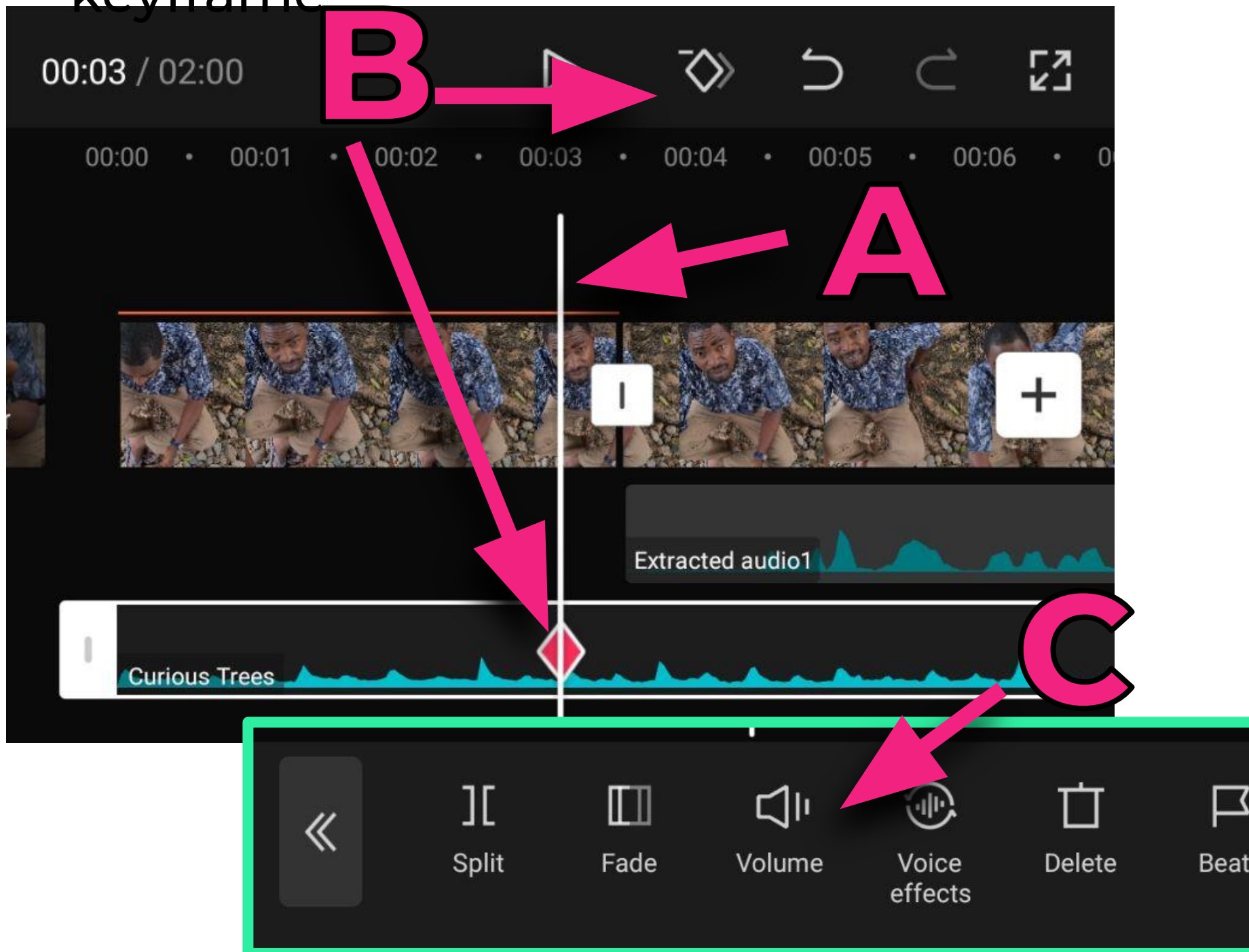
- Select the track you would like to adjust.
- Select **Volume**
- Increase or decrease the volume using the slider.
- Select ✓ to confirm your changes.



d. Fading audio over time

A. Move your playhead to the point where you want the volume to **start fading**.

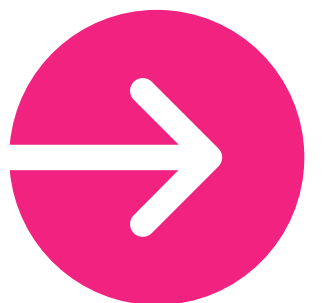
B. Select the **+ ♦** Button to add a keyframe



C. Select **Volume**

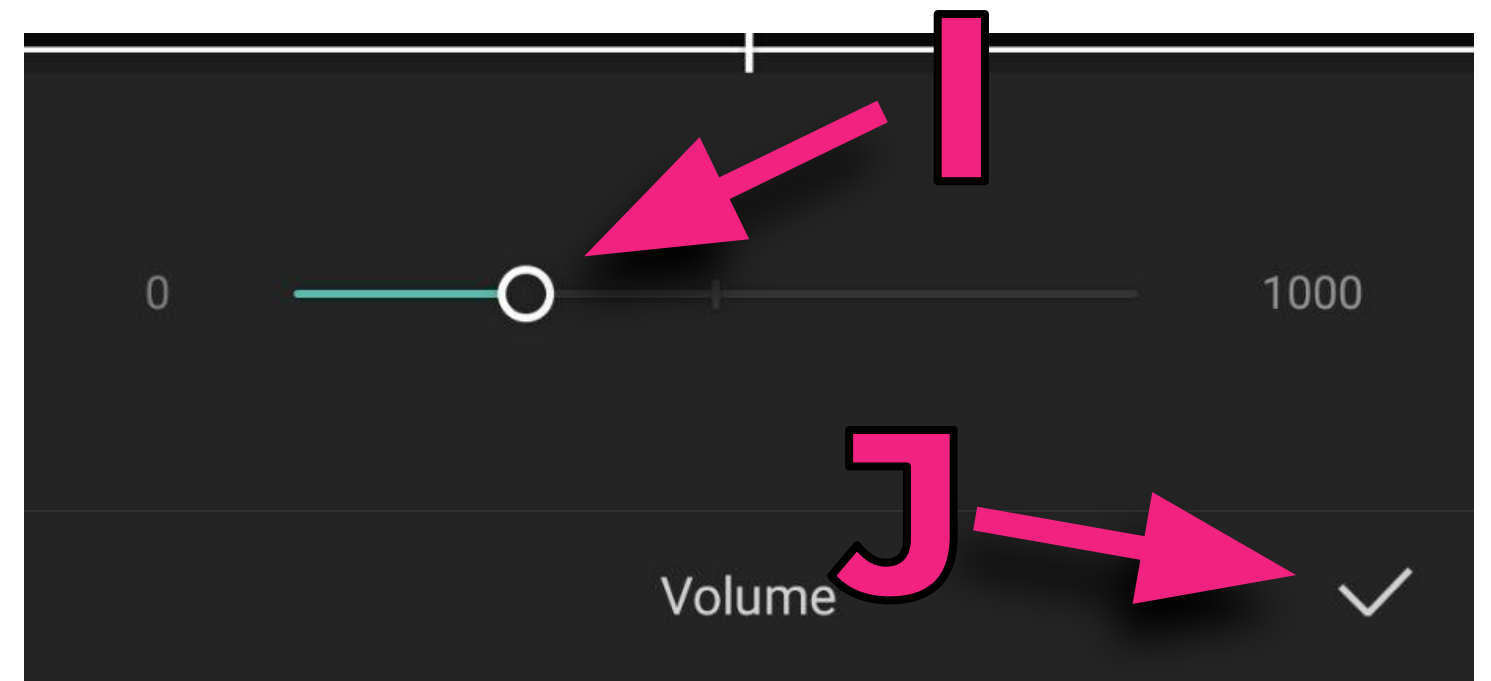
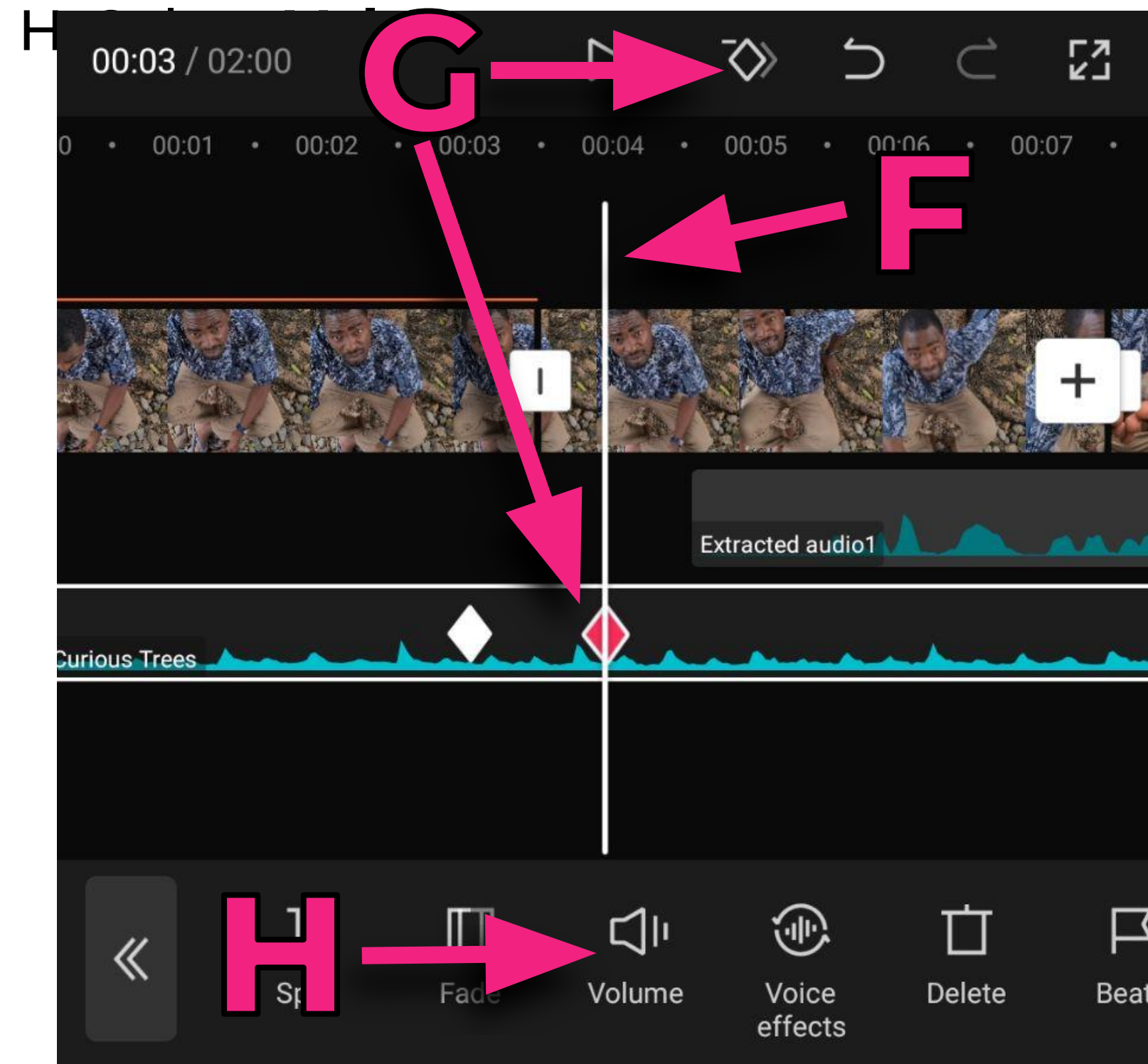
D. Adjust volume to your desired **starting volume**.

E. Select ✓ to confirm your changes.



F. Move your playhead to the point where you want the volume to **stop fading**.

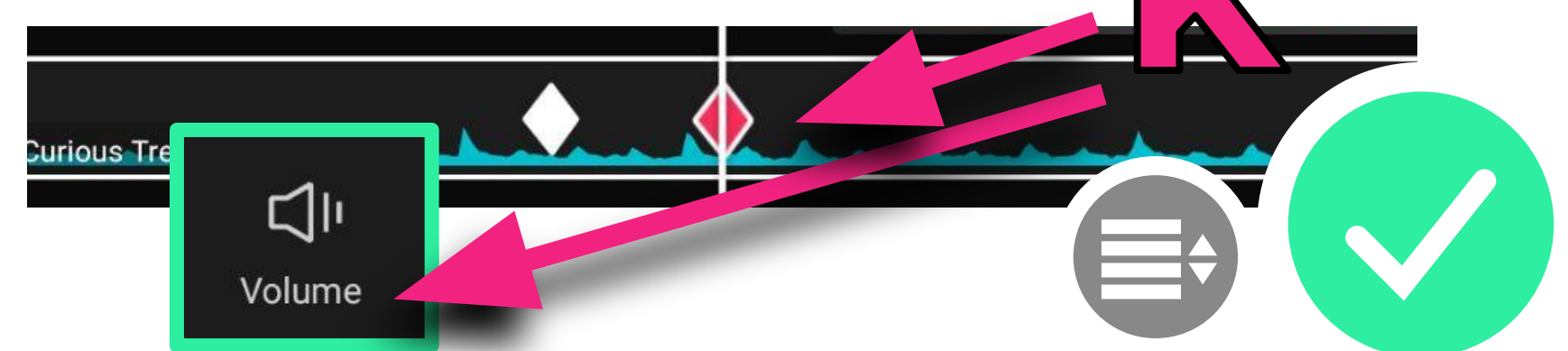
G. Select the **+ ♦ Button** to add a keyframe



I. Decrease your volume to the desired **end volume** level.

J. Select ✓ to confirm your changes. Your volume should now fade between the two keyframe diamonds! 🎉

K. To edit the keyframe again select the **♦ Diamond** and then **Volume**.

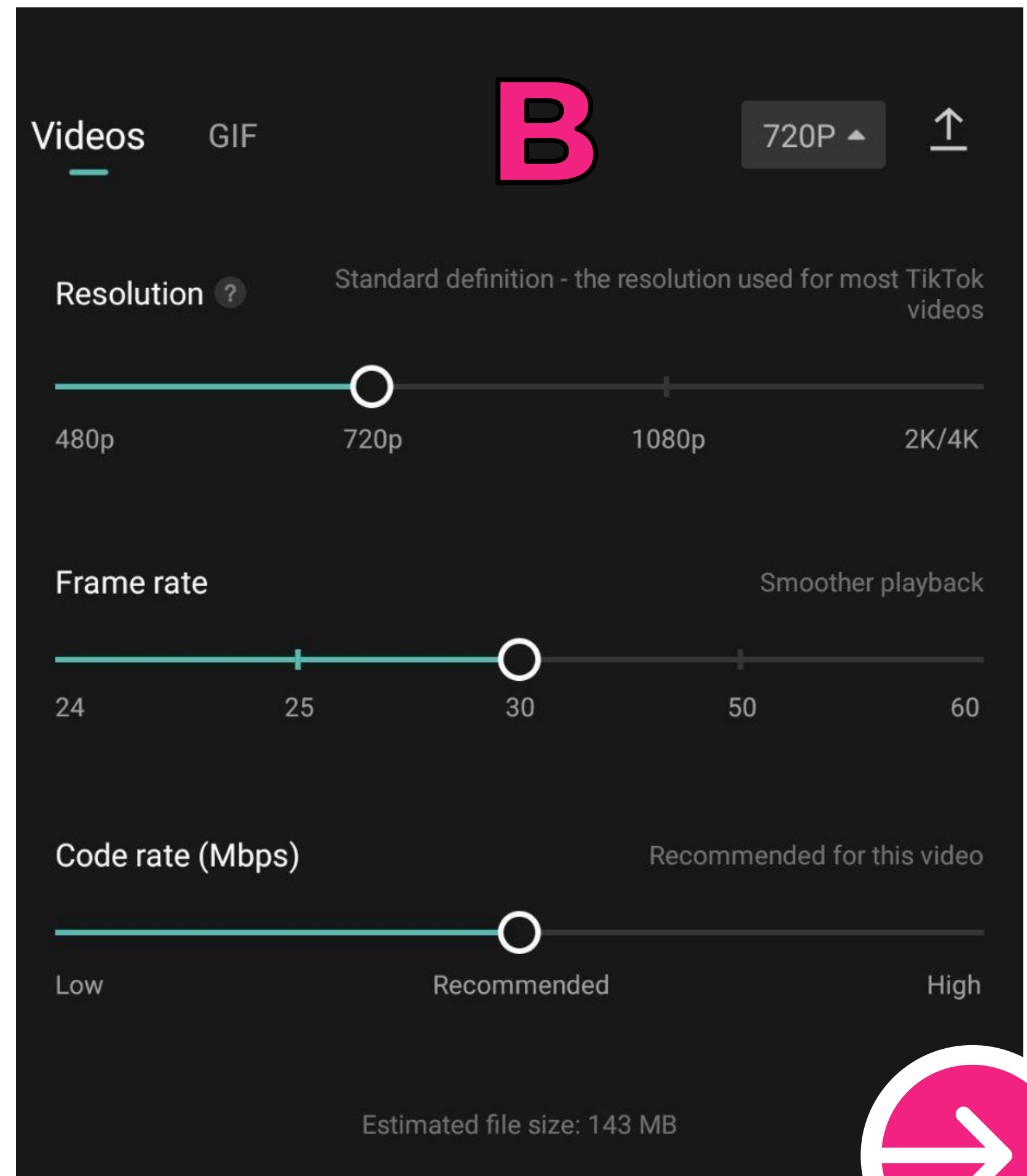
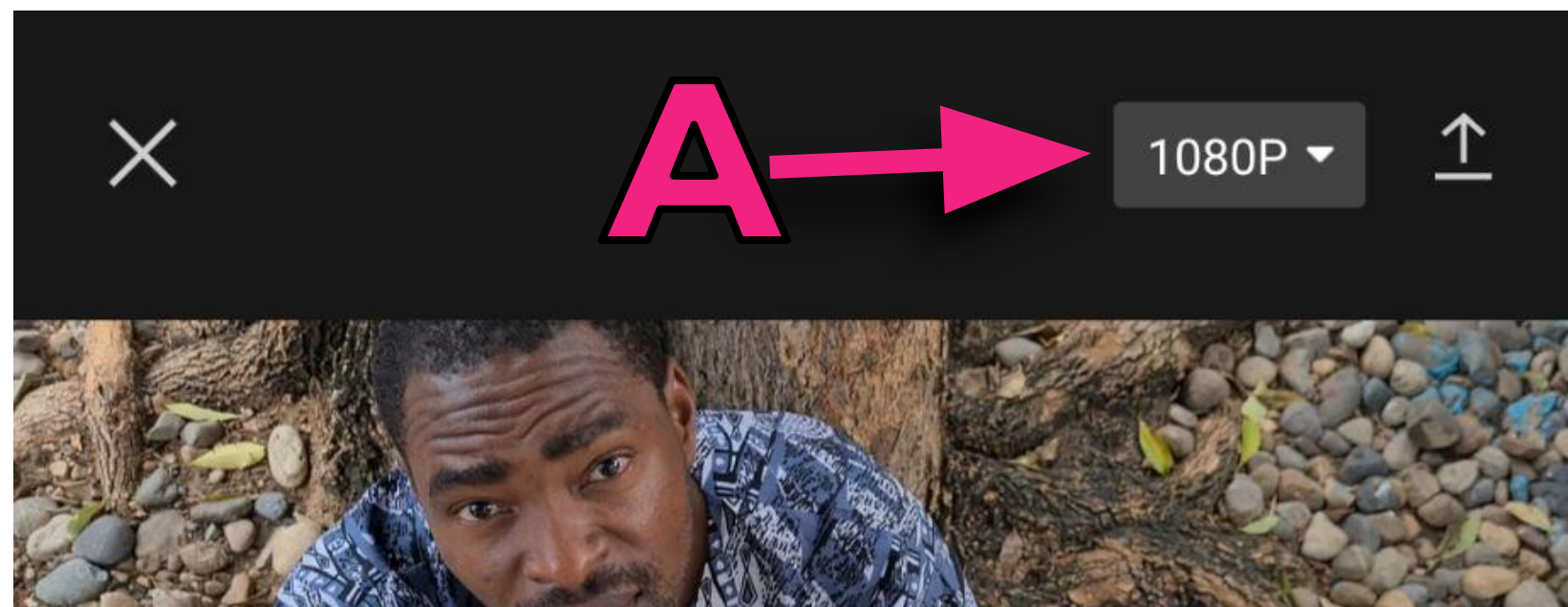


5. Exporting

A. Export settings are located at the top right of CapCut. Select the **gray box** that says 1080p or 720p.

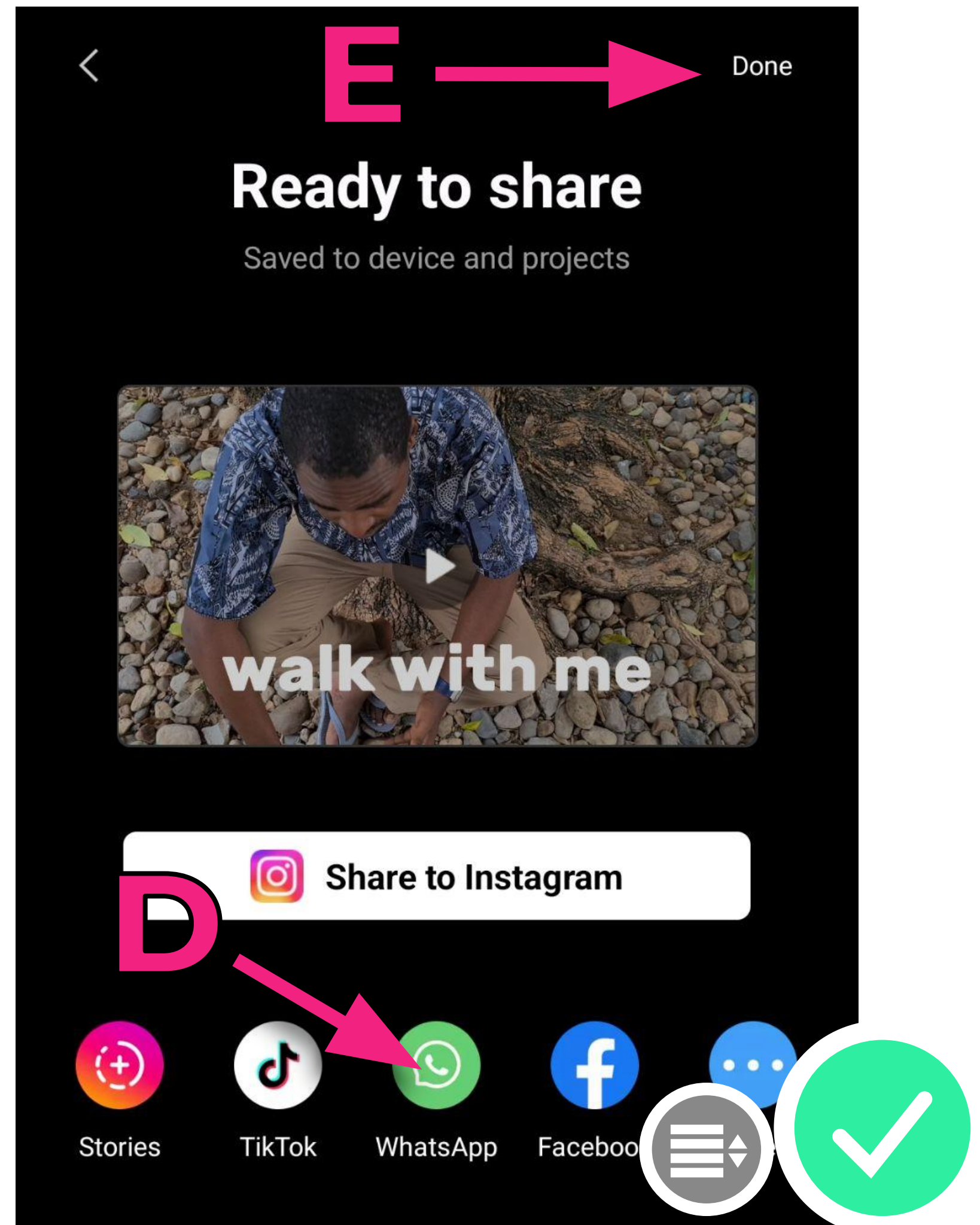
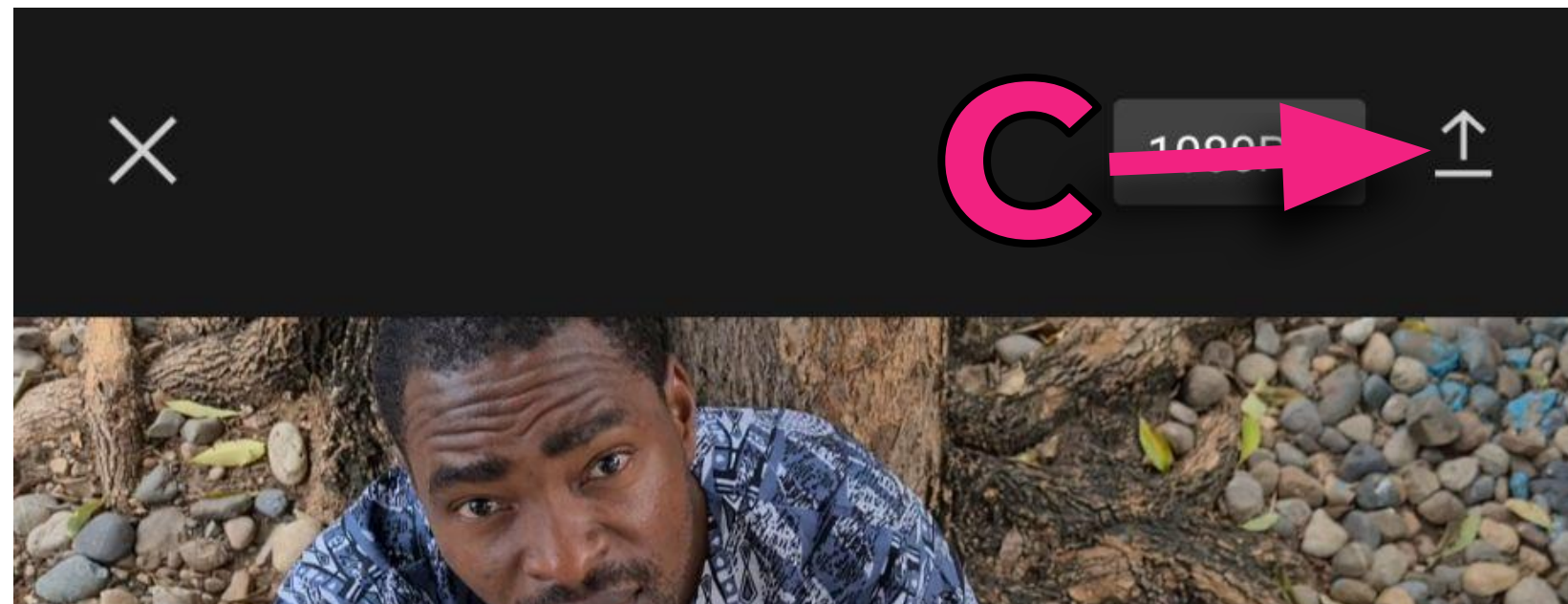
B. For smaller file size exports for WhatsApp we recommend a **Resolution** of 720, **Frame rate** 30 and **Code rate** Recommended.

NOTE: If you want a smaller file size then bring the sliders to the left. Larger to the right.



C. Finally select the **up arrow** in the far right to export! 🎉

D. You can share directly to social media
E. or select Done and the file will save in your phone's photo gallery and can be shared from there as well.

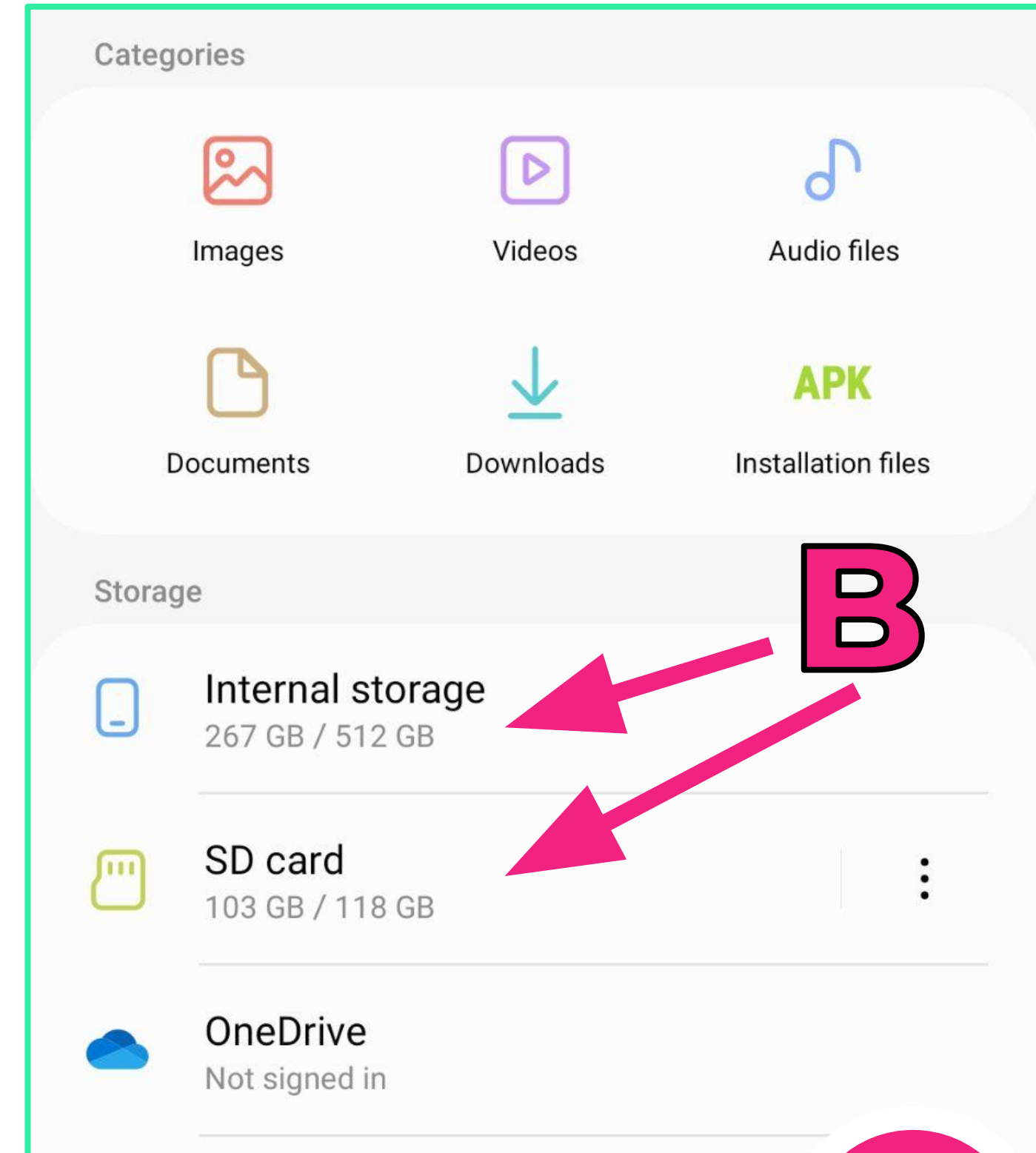
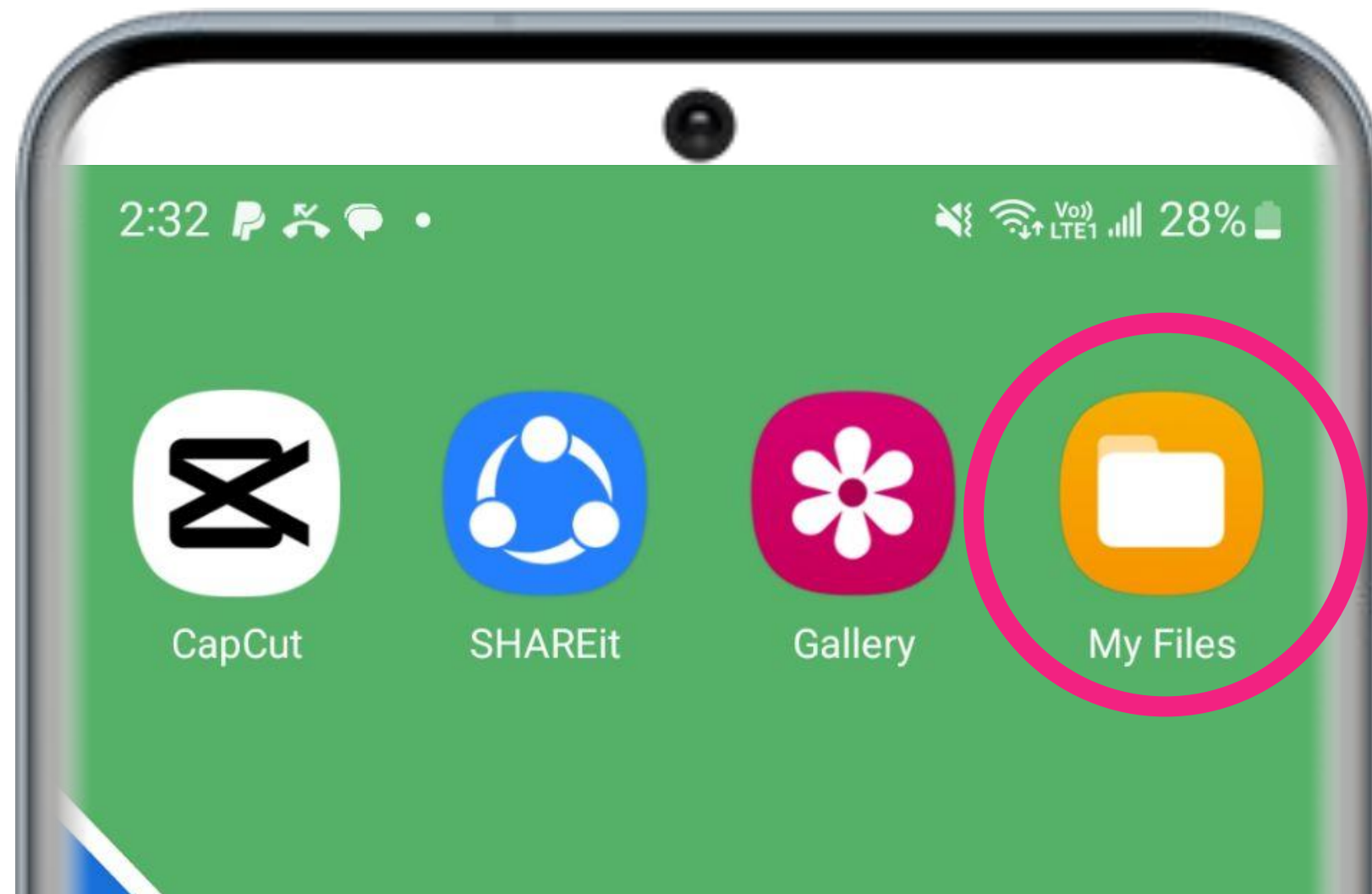
Management



a. Create a project folder

Moving all of your video files to one central location will make it easier to transfer footage and edit!

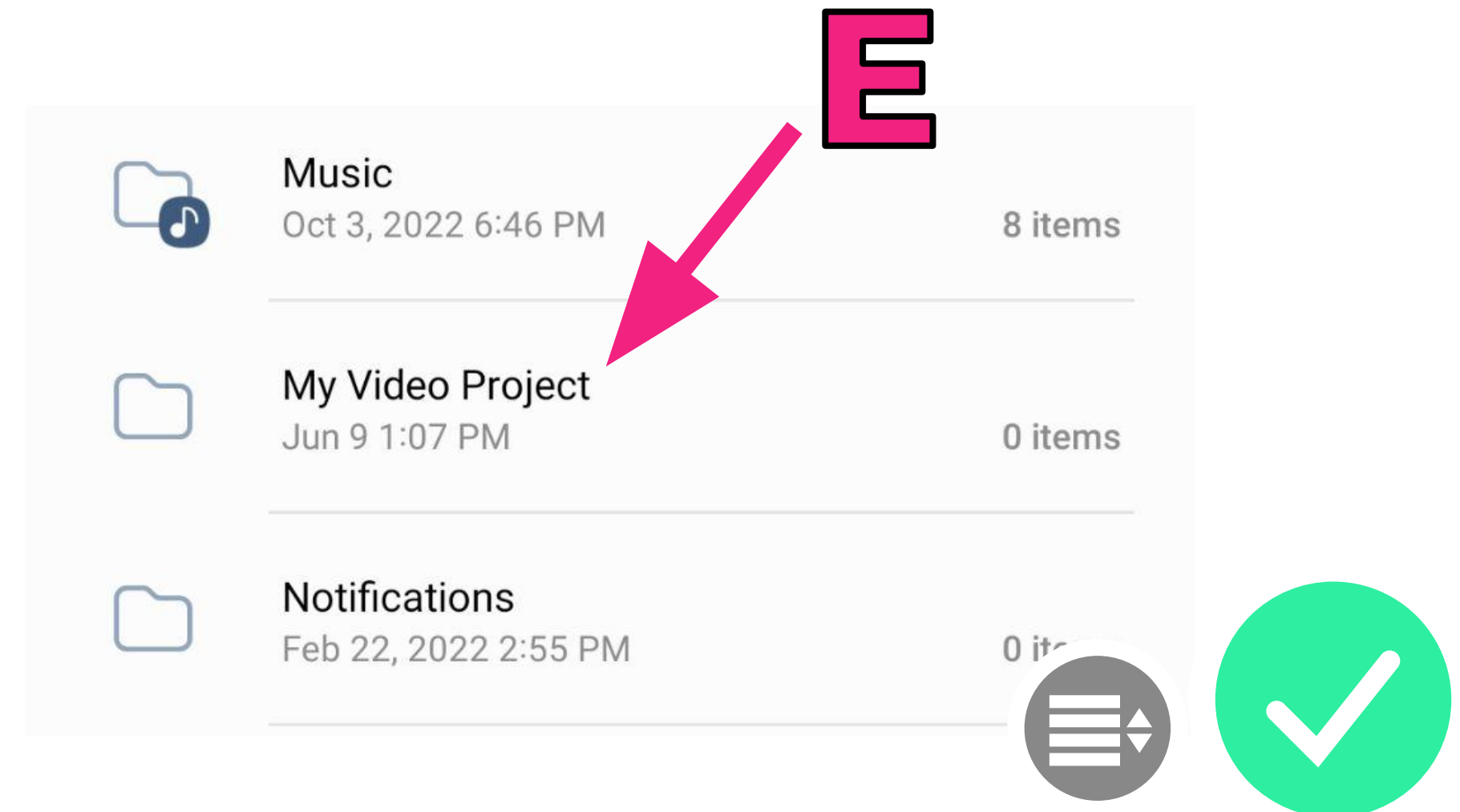
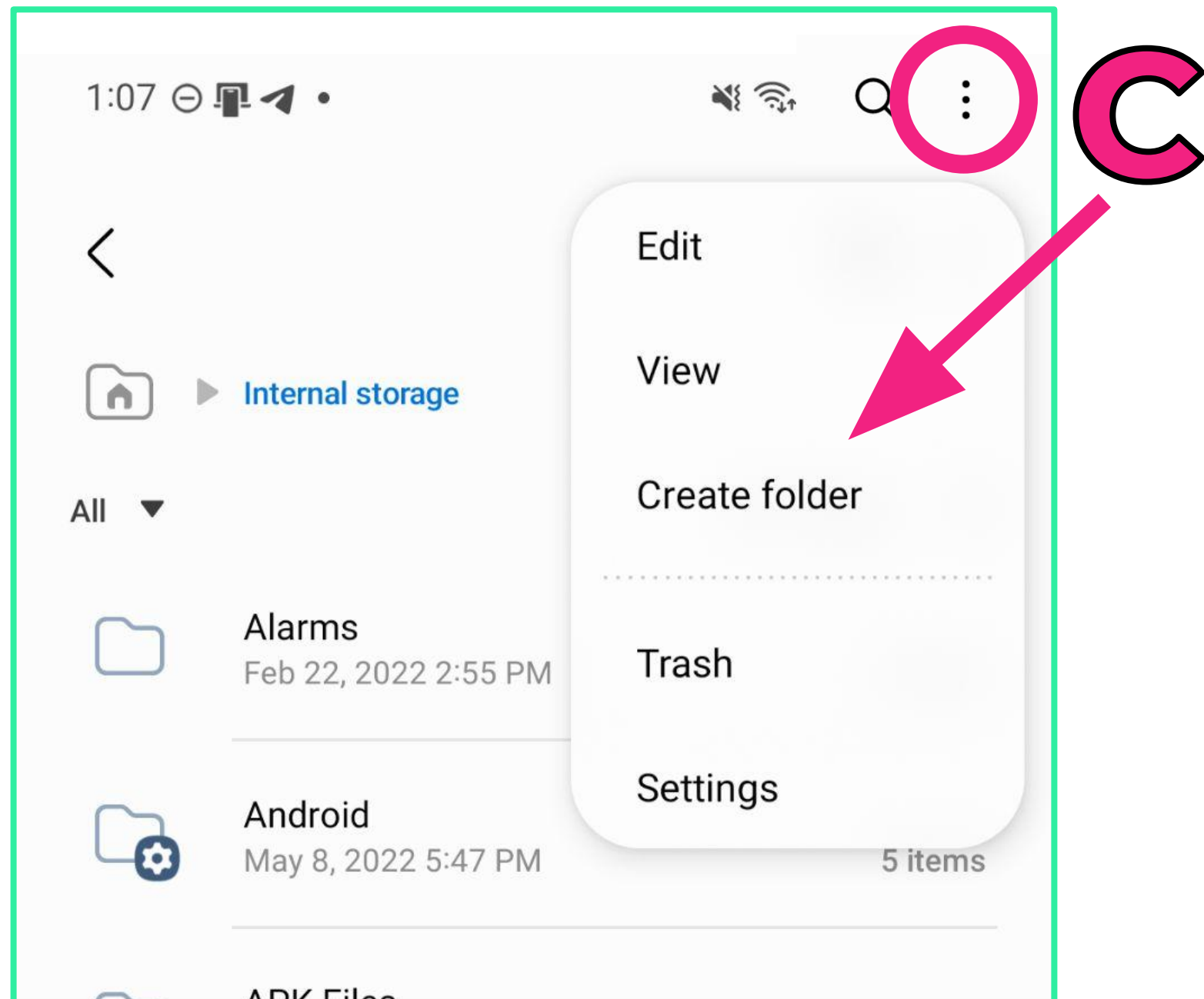
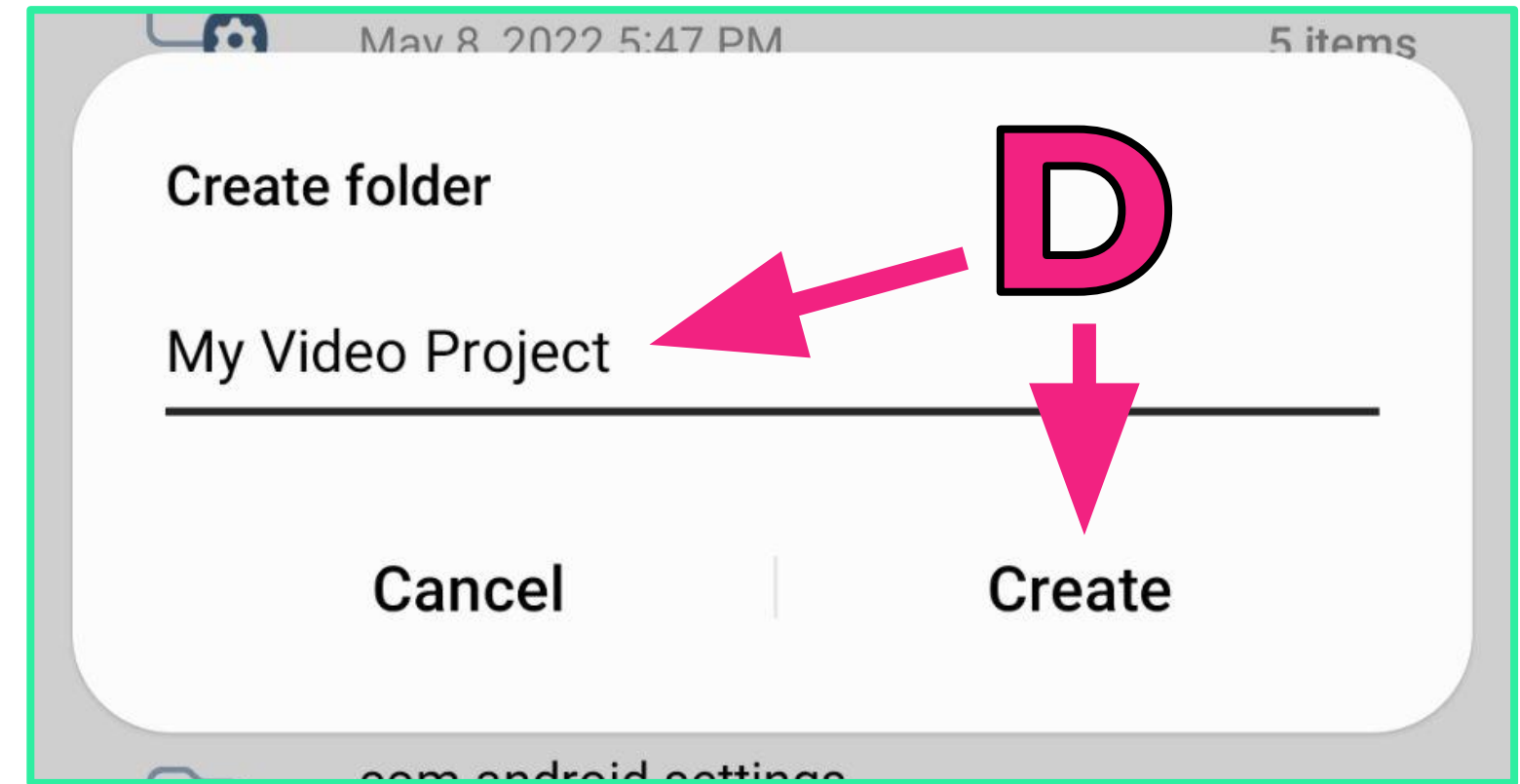
- A. Open **My Files** on your phone
- B. Select **Internal storage** or **SD card** depending on where you want to keep your project files.



C. Select **:** then select **Create folder**

D. Give your folder a **name** and then select **Create**

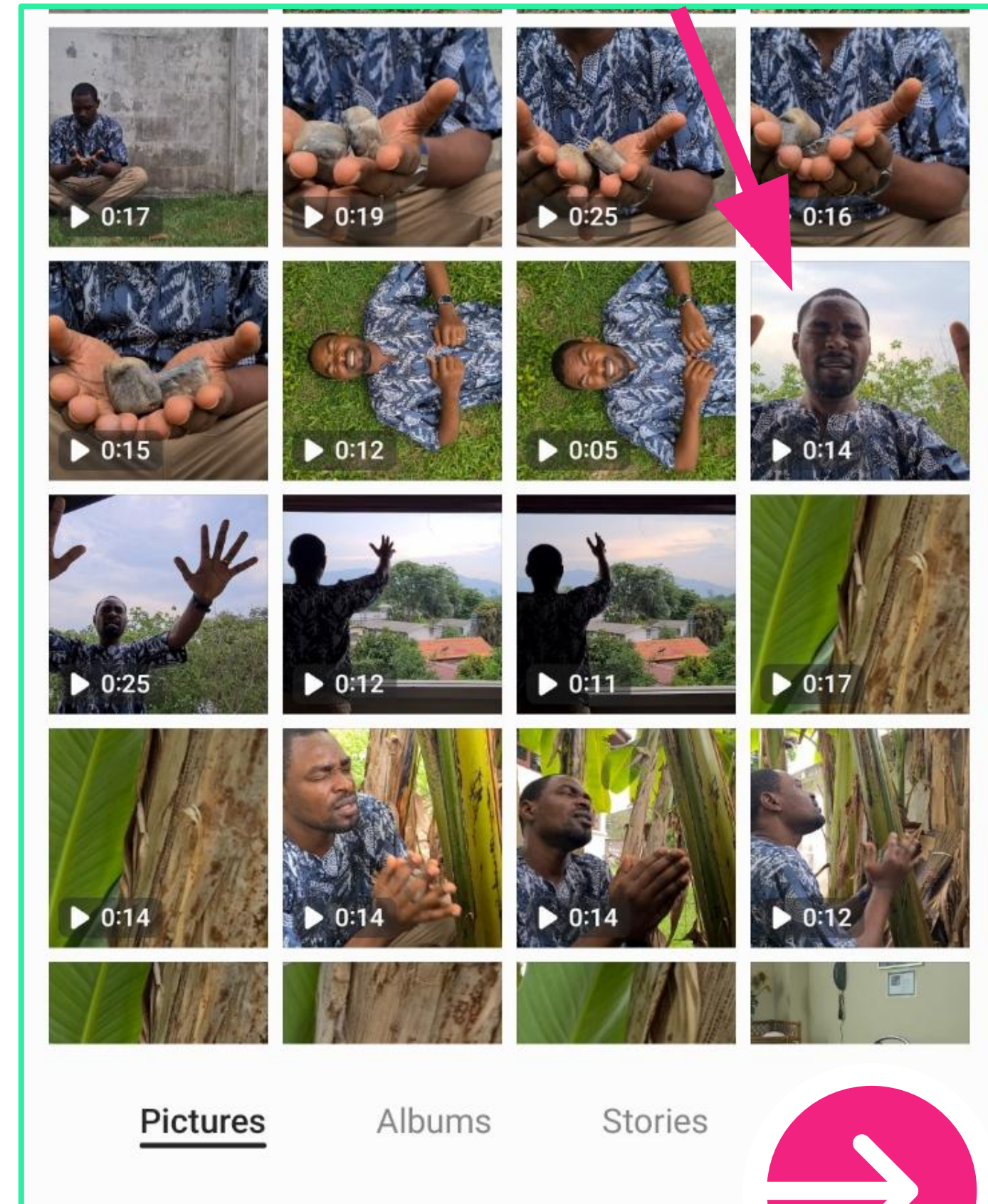
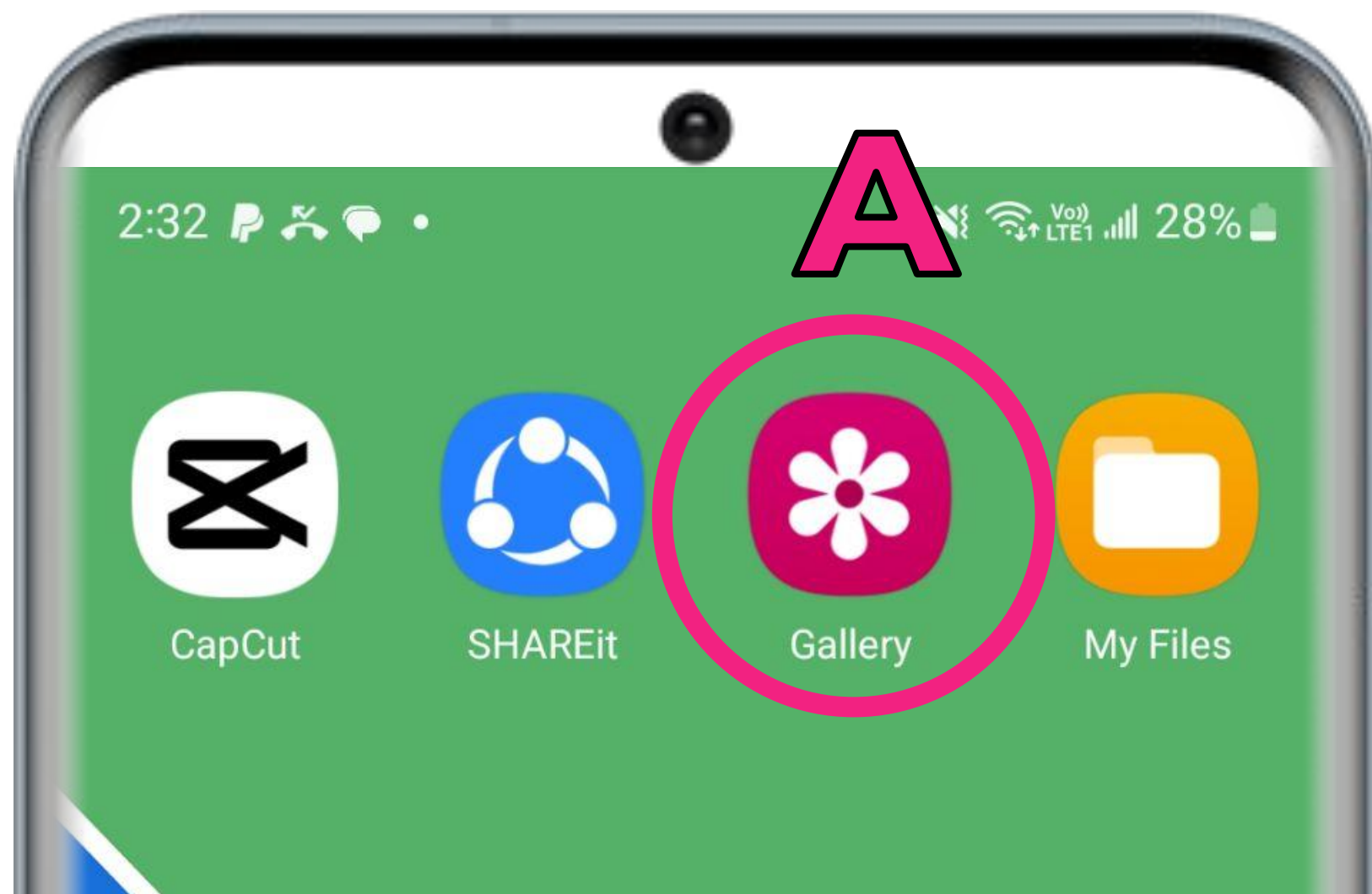
E. You're created a new project folder 🎉



b. Finding a video's location

Let's learn how to identify the hard drive location of a video (or photo) on your phone.

- A. Open **Gallery** on your phone
- B. Select any video in the group of videos you are looking for.

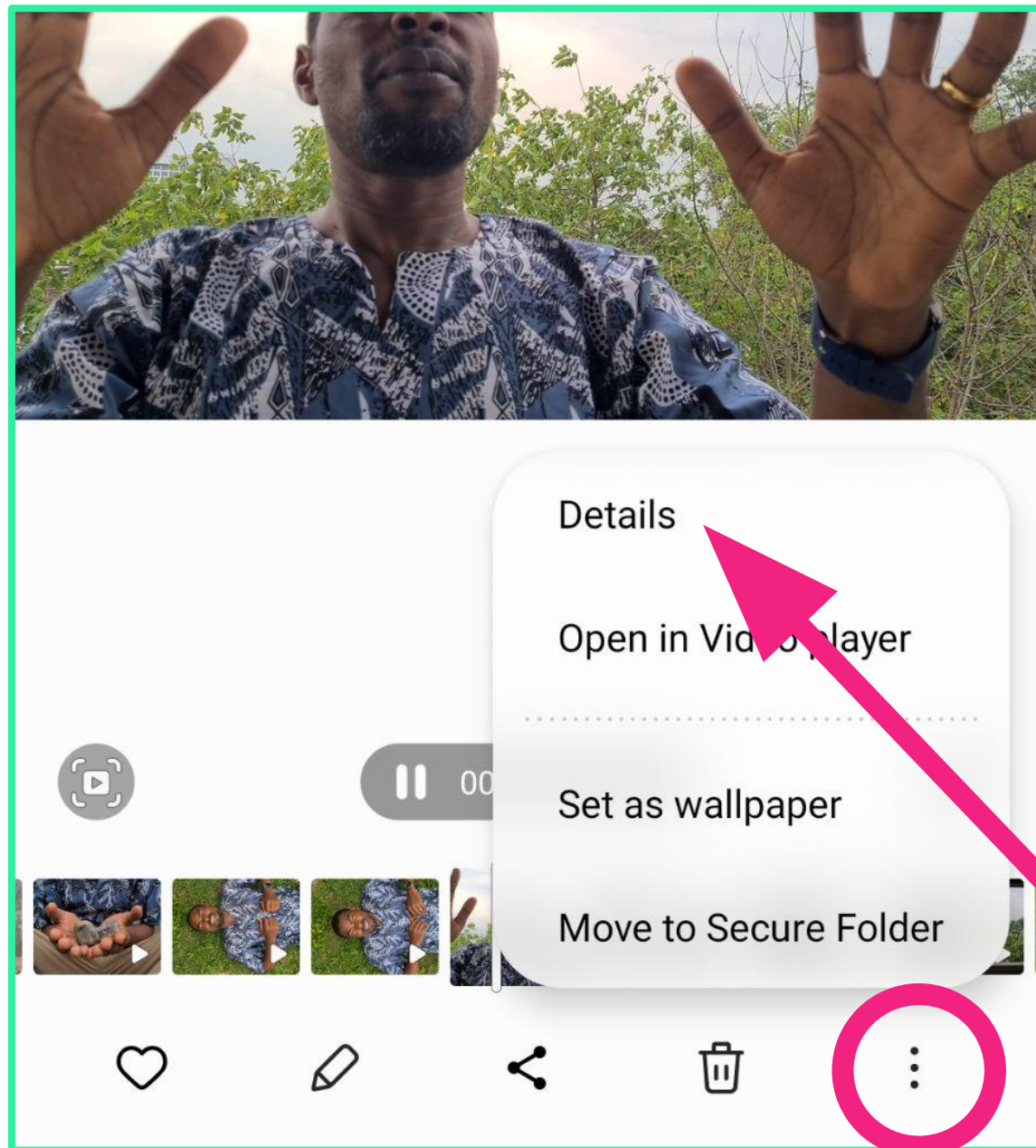

D. The hard drive location of that file will display below the image. “/” indicates a new folder. This example located at...

c. Moving files

Let's move your video files to a folder!

- A. Open **My Files** on your phone
- B. **Select** the videos you want to move.
(long press and hold)
- C. Then select **Move**

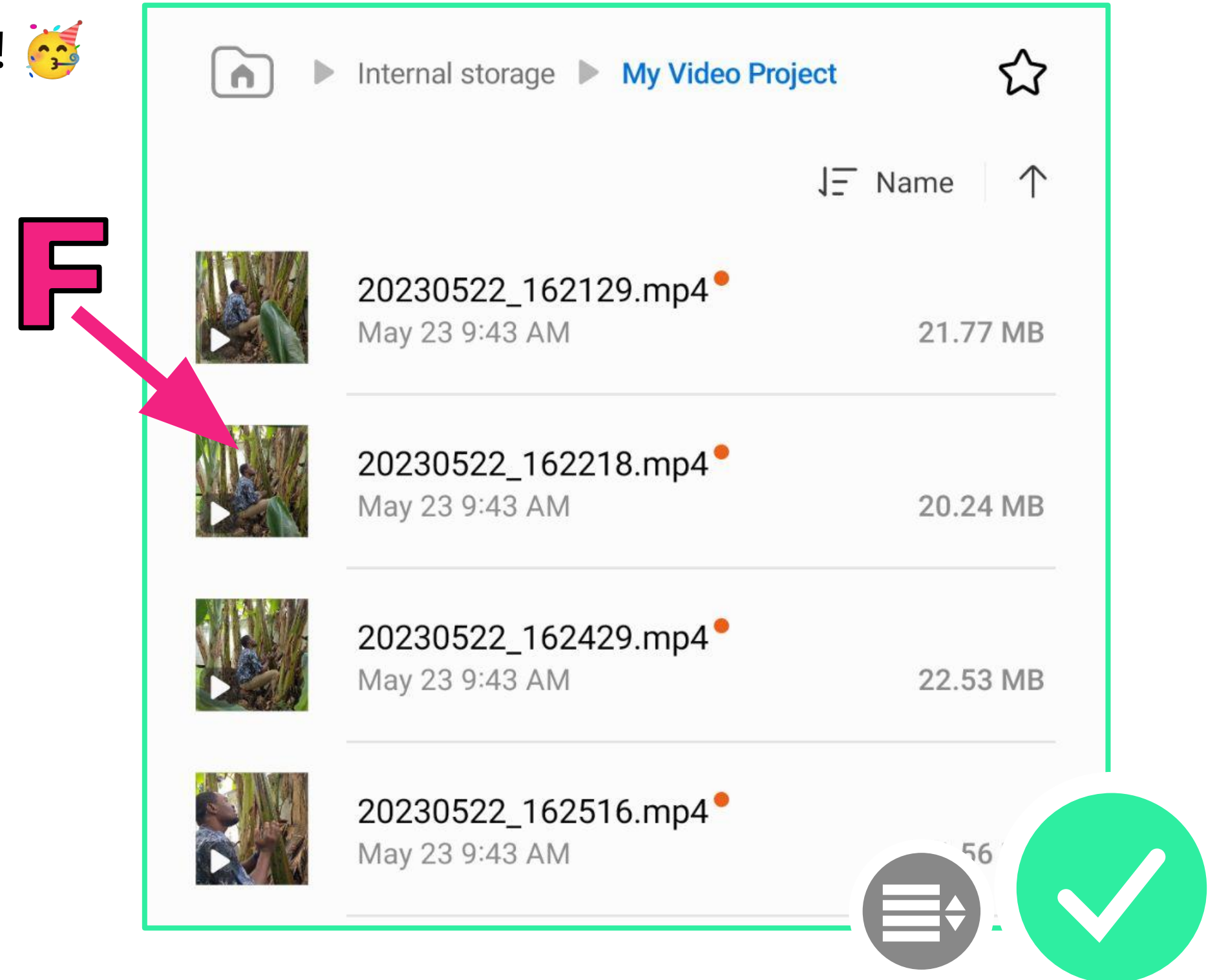
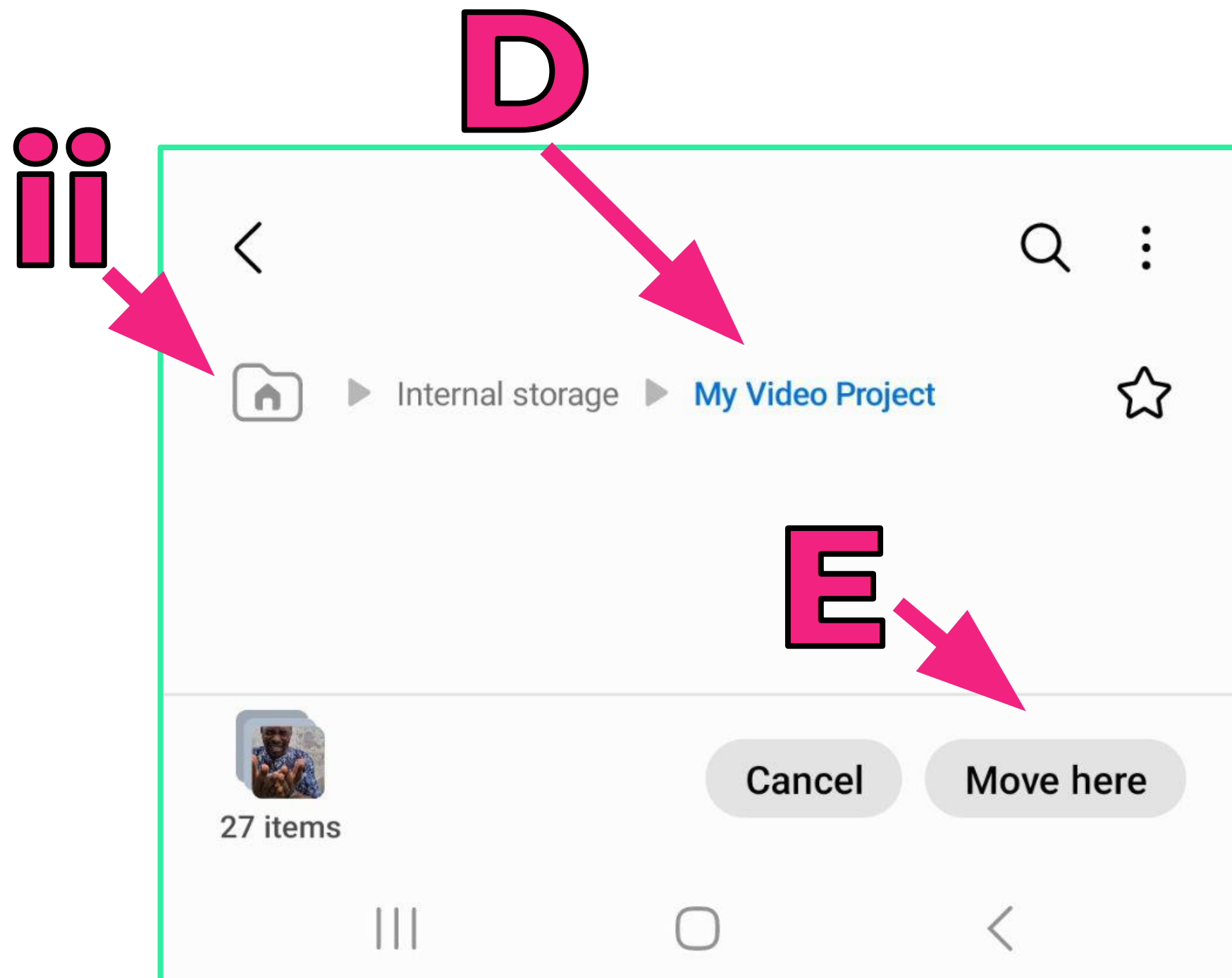


D. **Navigate** to the folder you would like to move your files.

ii. You can navigate to your SD card or Internal storage folder by clicking the 🏠 folder.

E. Then select **Move here**.

F. Your files will move to the new location! 🎉

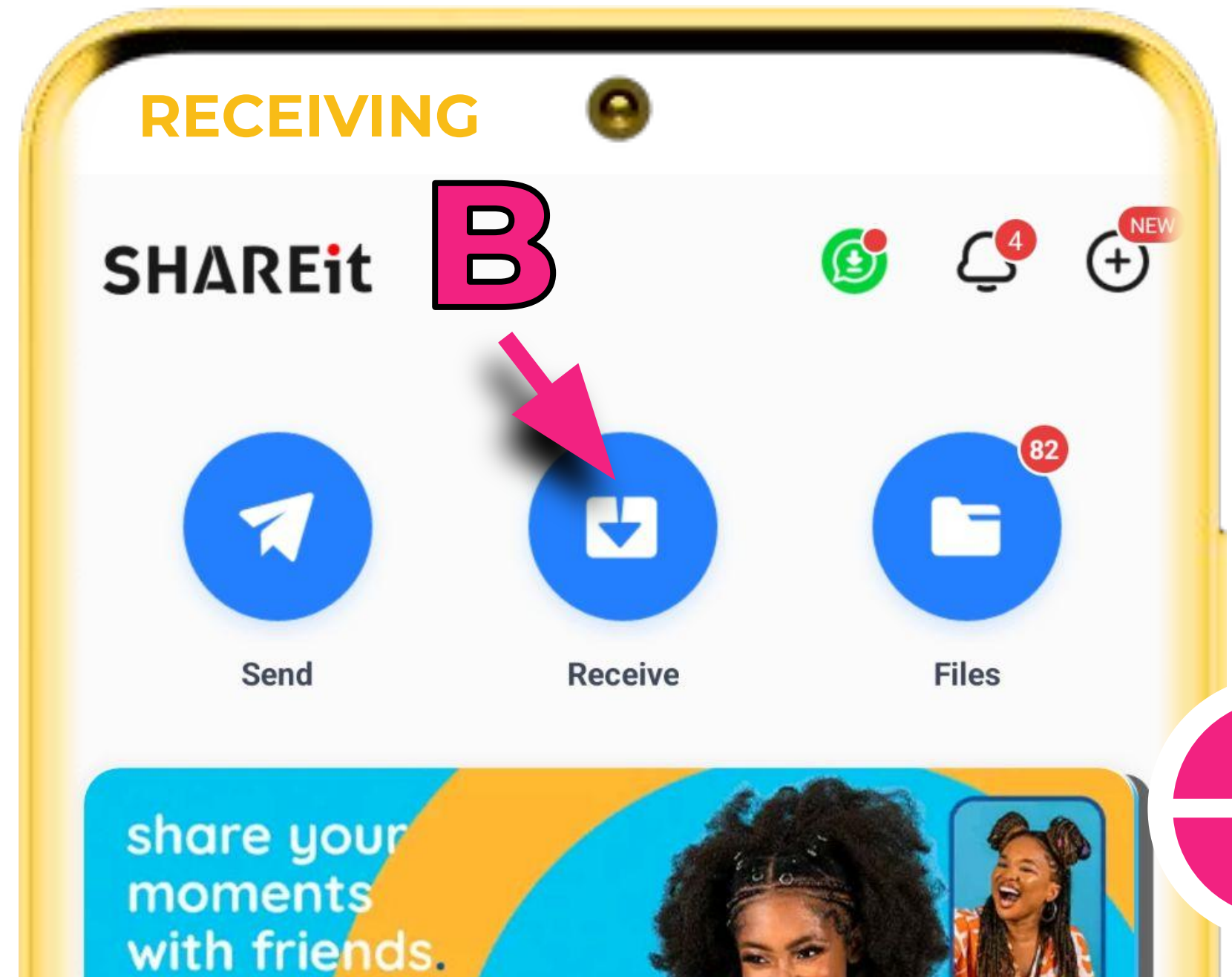
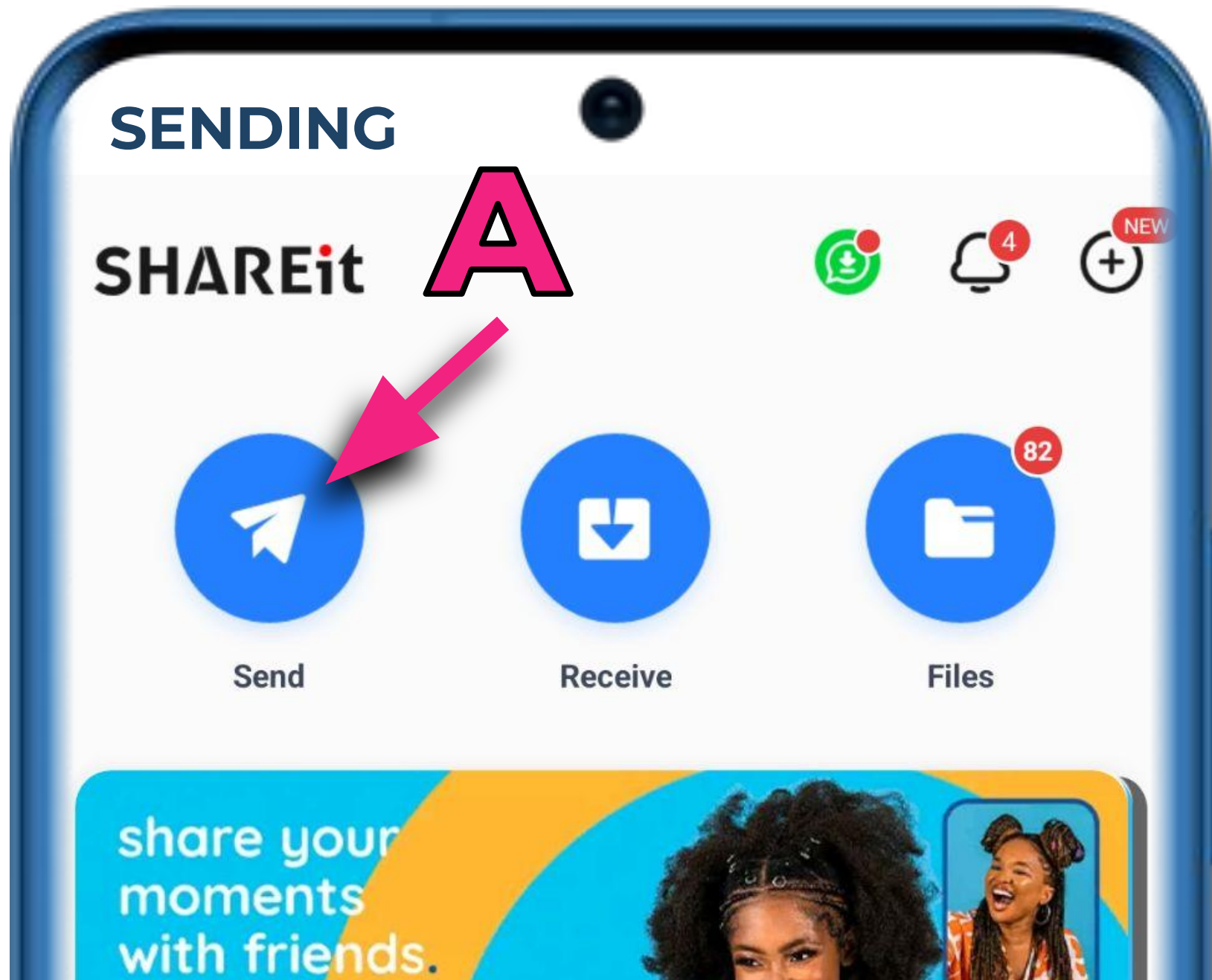


a. Android to Android

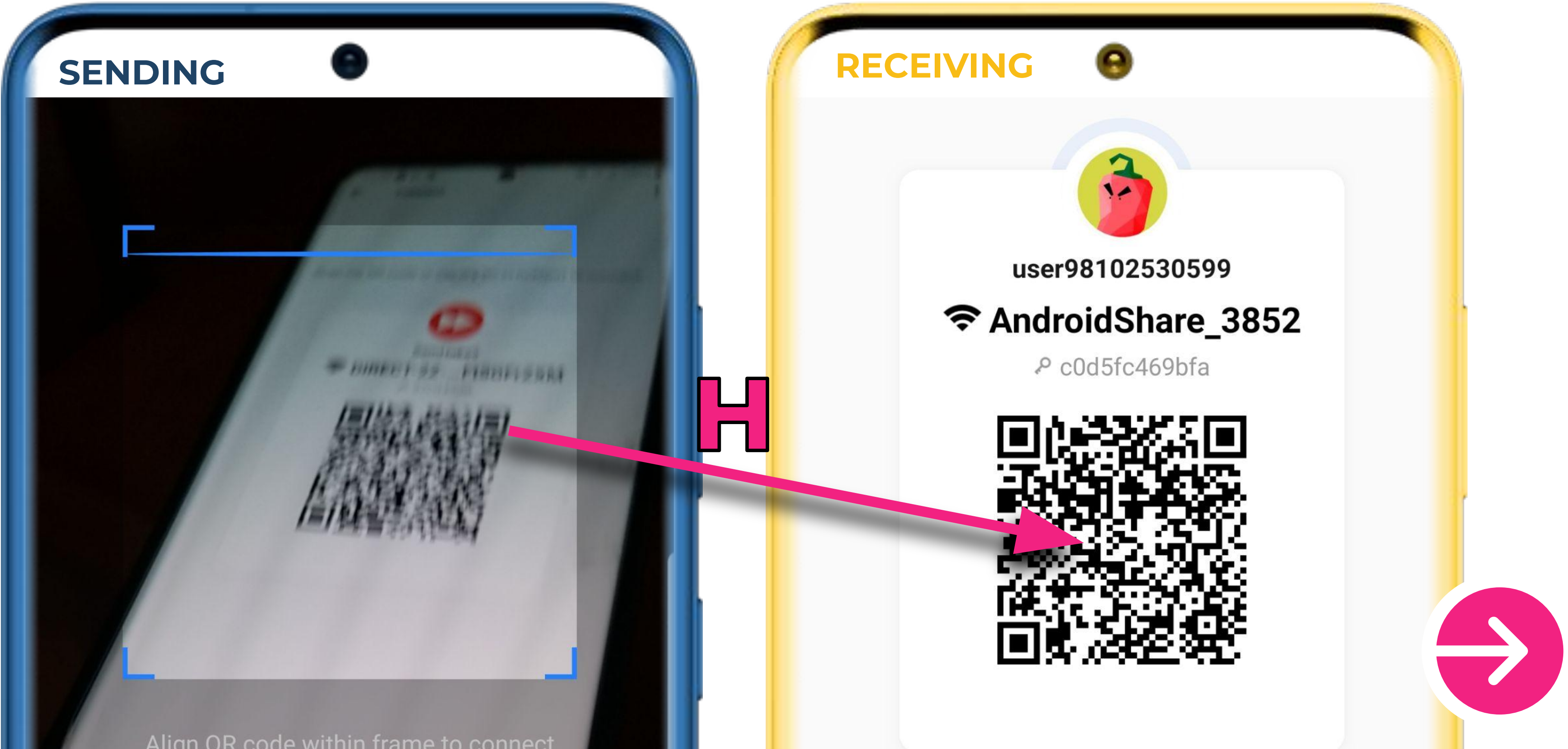


F. In the preparations window make sure to **OPEN** all required device settings.
